Guest speaker – stand in speaker, Ken did a great job!

Ken Clarke as a surprise speaker on CPR history and its background

- 1: In 1619, Shakespearean reference to machines bringing victims back to life
- 2: Early approaches to ventilation of drowning victims were unusual and non tested
- 3: Tobacco smoke enema does not appear to be effective these days
- 4: Rocking stretchers were used in the past as well
- 5: In 1958 mouth to mouth become recognized as an effective strategy
- 6: Later on compressions became more recognized as much as expired air
- 7: In 1960, electrical stimulation of the heart became accepted practice
- 8: Early resuscitation became the most recognized and effective approach
- 9: Training mannequins now have electronic feedback apps on smart phones
- 10: Low body temperature seems more effective for CPR survival long term
- 11: Suspended animation, patient cooled to 10degrees C, seems to have an emerging effectiveness
