Guest Speakers – Ross Smith & Andy Rajapakse on The Rotary Foundation and Paul Harris Fellows.

Presentation of PHF to Colleen Gauder.

Incoming District Governor 1919-1920 *, Andy spoke on the Foundation, providing statistics on our members contributions and RI in general, and how the money is distributed from RI, including to benefit our Club projects, such as PNG Kimbe project and the upcoming CCSS project.

PDG Ross expanded on some background to the Foundation

1: RI President, Arch Klumpf, initiated The Rotary Foundation at the International Convention in Atlanta in 1917. The first donation was to the value of \$US26.50

2: Arch Klumpf focussed TRF on Health and Education resulting with a view to international peace for all. This was enunciated as “ To do Good in the World”.

3: In 1947, on Paul Harris’ death, all Rotarians we’re asked by telegram to consider donations to TRF in lieu of flowers. \$US1.3M was so donated in his name.

4: Efficient and Effective money management in TRF stores funds largely in three areas: the Annual Fund which puts donations aside for three years prior to expenditure using the interest to cover management costs, the Endowment Fund which only spends the interest keeping the principal aside in perpetuity and the Polio Fund to manage the eradication of a Polio worldwide.

5: Donations to TRF can be made in a number of ways.

Commonly, PHF donations in your name, or another’s, occur with a one off payment of \$US1,000.

Paul Harris Society Membership provides for an ongoing annual donation of \$US1,000 in your name (approx. \$A114 per month)

Bequest Society members commit to donating \$10,000 to TRF in their will

Every Rotarian Every Year provides for an annual donation of \$US100 each year.

Many clubs encourage members to have 100% of members involved in this program annually.

The Rotary Foundation was selected as the International Foundation of the Year in 2016 due to its high quality financial scrutiny and the success of the Polio Fund.

Colleen said she was delighted to be involved with such a quality organisation as TRF and proud to the PHF medallion.
