Headache treatment with a physio background

Three types - headache, cluster headache, migraines (with or without aura)

Now considered on a spectrum of severity

Screening for causes and location of the pain is commonly the first treatment response

First neck disc is a common causal factor putting load on the top three discs sending referred pain to the brain stem

Triggers can also set off migraines

Posture is also a significant cause of these issues

Only 40 or so practitioners in this area in the country

Standing desks are often useful for our necks but be conscious of your hips being in a good place
