Rotary Foundation Ross: RAM (Rotarians Against Malaria) National meeting last weekend at Griffith University
TWO outstanding pieces of news on malarial Front
1: Timor Leste has converted a planned CONTROL Strategy into an ELIMINATION Strategy which is unheralded in the world - especially for a new, developing country. Wide ranging use of Impregnated Bed Nets combined with indoor spraying has reduced the presence of malaria to ZERO in the last two years.
2: The Griffith Gold Coast University Malaria Vaccine Project is going from strength to strength entering the human trial era now. The vaccine is safe but now must be tested for effectiveness in various countries and people. Looking forward to the outcome of this trial. The aim is to have a vaccine for less than One Dollar each and with a One-off inoculation !

David, Scooter Project : Three service calls today, on 48 scooters. Submitting an EOI for a \$100,000 Grant to replace 25 scooters in our current fleet that are aging.

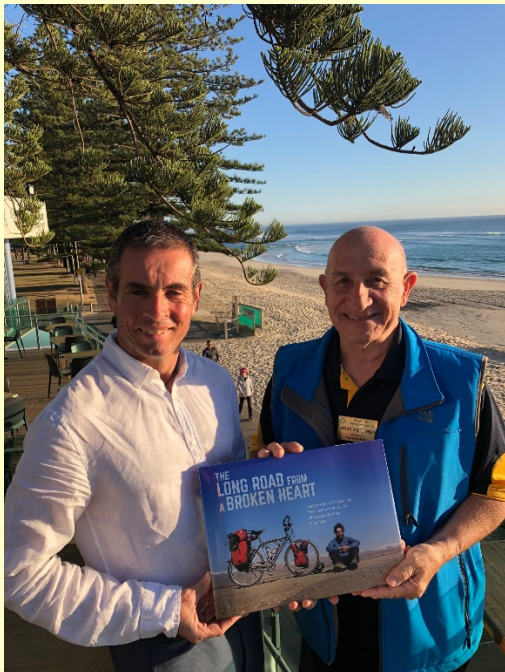

52,000km and two year bicycle ride, 2011 to 2014, from London to Auckland
“A Long Road from a Broken Heart” book now available
Born with a hole between the two heart chambers and a valve issue at two days old. Heart surgery at four years old - success.
This changed everything about his life. He sought purpose in his life as a result. He decided to ride around the planet on a bicycle.
He changed his plan to focus on Amsterdam first and broke the journey into manageable sections. 12 weeks to cycle across Europe and much improved physical and mental fitness.
The worst winter in Turkey in over fifty years - overnight 40 degrees below zero. Personal safety learnings early on, in the Middle East but most welcoming people, generally, in both hospitality and accommodation.
A focus on heart Foundations in Aust., NZ and UK emerged from a chance encounter in Vietnam.
8,000km through Australia and then to NZ to Auckland Medical School to complete the ride.
First day in London his alarm went off and he questioned himself but got on with it by not making excuses.
