TOPIC: RCBH – Ossu Parish, East Timor Partnership

- 1: Timor Leste is amongst the poorest countries in Asia
- 2: 62% of the nation is under 25 years of age
- 3: The nation cannot afford enough places for all the young people to attend school
- 4: While state schools are partially supported many parish–run Catholic schools are in very poor condition and receive little or no funding.
- 5: Bren and Sue (see photos below) have represented the RCBH, through RAWCS, Durack, and the Marymount Catholic community (including the Marist Development fund) in a restoration project at St. Teresinha's Junior Catholic High School.
- 6: The complete refurb scheme involved the renovation of 6 classrooms, a small library and an administration section and the fitout of same.

7: The total, final bill was USD \$166,365.00 A magnificent combined effort. The building commenced in early 2016 and the opening was in January this year.
