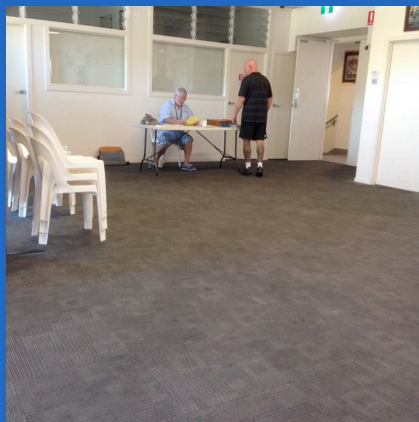

Guest speaker:

This morning was Andy's chance to bring us up to date on the Club's upcoming Pacific Fair promotion. This is an ambitious PR effort and all Club members are asked to support it with the ultimate goals being to promote the good work of our Club and Rotary in general, as well as to attract new members.

The redeveloped Pacific Fair will be officially opened in April and has a new two level precinct joining the existing precinct with 120 new stores.

Andy confirmed that we will have a kiosk at Pacific Fair on Saturday's 30 January, 27 February, 26 March, 30 April, 28 May and 25 June - so ink these into your diaries. We are required to be at the booth from 9-5pm, then pack up.

You need to know your login info. If you don't, email Rhonda and she'll send to you. Here's how to do it.





1. go to www.BurleighHeadsRotary.com.au
2. Click on MEMBER LOGIN in top right hand corner.
3. Login and your password
4. Click on MEMBER AREA in top right hand corner
5. Under MY CLUBRUNNER, click EMAIL MESSAGE CENTRE
6. Click on COMPOSE NEW MESSAGE (orange button on right hand side)
7. Check the box ACTIVE AND HONORARY MEMBERS. If you want to send to selected members, click on the box with a cross and then select names you need
8. Type your subject then your message.
9. Click on SELECT FILES FOR UPLAOD (blue button below message dialogue box), if required.
10. Finally, click SEND (orange button at bottom)
