John and Connor from PEAK Health Club

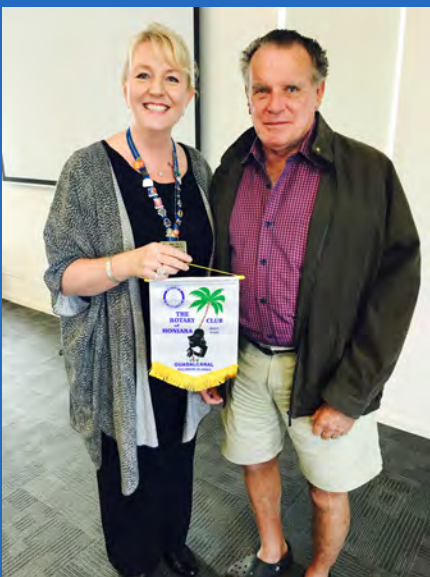


- Spreading the good health message about the importance of chiropractic health
