Guest Speaker was imminent new member Renee Jorgensen who gave us a magnificent talk with an extensive screen display with laser curser "Trawler in Scotland" which described quite a bit about the early and current trawler times in Jutland, Denmark and North East Scotland. Chair Graham Toms and Sergeant Phil Smith were our dangerous duo this week who made sure we did not get away with any smart stuff.



Past President Ken advised that the Mental Health Symposium (which has another special name for the content this year) is about to commence committee meetings. Traction continues for the Tug of War event on 12 October at Broadwater Parklands. Next week Ella James, Gail McGaw and Rene' Jorgensen are going to be welcomed and inducted as our newest members to our great little Rotary Club.

Rene' Jorgensen (Guest Speaker) was born in Hansholm, Jutland, Denmark where he and his family have owned and operated trawlers for many years. The industry took him to Peterhead and Fraserburgh, north of Aberdeen, in the years before he and his wife Bella came to Australia. Renee had terrific photos of the fleet of very large trawlers which operate from Peterhead for kipper and



alternately mackerel, bringing home hundreds of tons of fish every few days in season from as far north as off the Shetland Islands. The trawler nets are usually large enough to fit 35 jumbo jets, have to be at middepth in the sea and away from the sea bottom, they catch only kippers when trawling for kippers, they have a crew of 12 very highly skilled and paid trawler men, absolutely state of the art equipment for all functions and the 75 metre trawlers are powered with 7,000 kilowatt engines and bow and stern thrusters. Another total fascination were the extensive photos of Aberdeen, Peterhead and Fraserburgh, and Hansholm, before and after the early trawler fleets went from sail to steam power and then to diesel, the fishery handlers who moved from port to port to clean and

pack the even originally large catches - they quite clearly all enjoyed their lives. The current fleet of large trawlers still catch almost as many tons of kippers as in the days of the much smaller trawlers in very large fleets of trawlers a hundred years ago. The fishing grounds have not been fished out and the activities appear to have been regulated for a very long time. President Eric thanked Renee on behalf of us all for an intensely interesting talk about his beloved industry.


