<u>Runaway Bay – Why would you live anywhere else!!</u>

This following is an extract of an email I sent to local dental surgeries, the response was disappointing, however we did receive some vital equipment, which is now packed into a container at Underwood ready for shipment to PNG.

Good morning folks,

I write to ask your support in allowing me to collect any unwanted dental equipment/supplies which are superfluous to your needs. We're sending these to Nathan Polty, an inspirational PNG dental student who completed his studies at University of Canberra in 2018. Nathan's passion is to set up a chain of Outpost Dental Clinics. I'm hoping you may have time to read Nathan's story which is attached above and demonstrates the desperate need of our PNG neighbours.

To date we've received 7 x dental chairs; 6 x autloclaves; and a variety of instruments [used] etc. A 20 foot shipping container is being packed at Underwood, Brisbane, and will be despatched to Lae - then travel by road to the PNG Highlands.

Thanking you and hoping you will find it in your heart to help.

In mid-2018, James Marape, Minister for Finance PNG, visited our shed at Underwood to discuss how we could help them. As Member for the Hela Province, James was struggling to feed the people who had been devastated by the recent earthquakes and were leaving their shattered villages and walking to his Province for assistance. He wanted to set up a soup kitchen and other facilities. We had been donated a massive amount of commercial cooking equipment and James requested this, and many other items, to be sent to him – via Port of Lae; then approx. 3 days by truck up the mountain to the end of the road to Pai where he's developing a huge community to look after his people [hospitals; schools; police station; etc] James paid for the shipping costs and arranged and paid for road transport from his Parliamentary budget/allowance and is encouraging his fellow-members to do likewise. James is now the new Prime Minister of PNG.

Rachael Marape is the wife of James Marape. I've been negotiating to work with Rachael Marape who is considering setting up a "First Lady Charity" in order to receive and handle all containers I can send. Rachael's passion is twofold - to engage the services of reliable women to distribute the goods to those in need in their communities – thus empowering the women into roles of responsibility and providing training into the logistics of doing such a task; whilst at the same time supplying the desperate aide to these districts.

I'm using the \$5,000 provided by the Rotary Club of Runaway Bay to send a container [via First Lady Charity] up to Tari/Pai where Nathan Polty will set up the first of the chain of dental clinics to treat the school children of the Highlands. We have this now ³/₄ packed at our Underwood depot and **it contains 12 x dental chairs and 6 x autoclaves/sterilisers**. James will help Nathan to establish this clinic which will be used as a showpiece and incentive for all PNG District Reps to view – with the possibility of their also paying some of their Parliamentary budgets towards doing the same in their Provinces.

The dental clinic in the following images – is a stand-alone building formerly used as an aid post by the Catholic Health Agency. *"It was given for use as a dental clinic by the agency when requested. There is water supply but no power running through yet. Plans are under way to get power in now. The facility is secure with a concerned local community and a metal fencing with locked gates. The building is ideally located and easily accessed Nathan Polty"*
