



#### **>1,700** students

Since 1982 we've exchanged more than 1, 650 students with 30 countries.

#### 41,250 connections

If each of these students connected with only **25** others, this results in 41,500 connections.

#### 5 million +

Globally, over 40 years, the result would be more than 5 million connections worldwide! Many of these last a lifetime, and are the start of a connection to Rotary.

#### 2023/2024/2025 - D9640 RYE in numbers!







- Sent out 23 Long Term (12 month) outbound students, inc. 1 one-way exchange from Ukraine.
- Welcomed 16 Long Term (12 month) inbound students with 8 more to arrive in July 2025.
- Sent out 8 short-term (3 month) outbound students and received 8 in return.
- 19 Rotary clubs participated
- TOTAL of 63 amazing young people who have benefitted from Rotary Youth Exchange!

## SPONSORING OUTBOUND

LTEP: Sponsorship fee in 2024 will be \$400 per student.

The sponsored student pays a program fee to cover costs – approx. \$10,500 AUD. Up to 50% less than other exchange programs.

#### **HOSTING INBOUND**

#### LTEP:

- Pocket money \$150 per month.
- Rotary meeting costs.
- Optional: school costs.
- Help us find host families (2-4) note host families do not get paid.


