


FRAMING THE QUESTION

- WORLD HERITAGE CITIES ARE GLOBALLY RECOGNISED FOR THEIR CULTURAL VALUE, YET LOCALLY, THEY STRUGGLE TO SUSTAIN LIVEABLE CONDITIONS FOR RESIDENTS
- CENTRAL TENSION: HOW DO WE PRESERVE THE PAST WHILE ENABLING A QUALITY PRESENT AND RESILIENT FUTURE?
- SUSTAINABILITY CHALLENGE: BALANCING HERITAGE PRESERVATION WITH SOCIO-SPATIAL EQUITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH




DEFINITIONS MATTER

- LIVEABILITY REFERS TO IMMEDIATE, TANGIBLE URBAN CONDITIONS: ACCESSIBILITY, SAFETY, COMMUNITY WELL-BEING AND PUBLIC AMENITIES
- SUSTAINABILITY ADDRESSES LONG-TERM ECOLOGICAL, ECONOMIC RESILIENCE AND SOCIAL VIABILITY
- THOUGH COMPLEMENTARY, THEY DIFFER IN SCOPE AND TEMPORAL FOCUS
- LIVEABILITY OFTEN UNDERSTOOD USING STANDARDISED SOCIO-ECONOMIC METRICS, OVERLOOKING ON-THE-GROUND EXPERIENCES (SENSE OF PLACE)
- A LIVEABLE CITY MAY NOT ALWAYS BE SUSTAINABLE, AND VICE VERSA...
 THE GOAL OF EFFECTIVE PLANNING IS TO INTEGRATE BOTH




LIVEABILITY & SUSTAINABILITY IN WORLD HERITAGE CITIES

• BUILT HERITAGE INTERSECTS WITH ALL THREE PILLARS – ENVIRONMENT, ECONOMY AND SOCIETY



- ADAPTIVE REUSE OF HISTORIC BUILDINGS REDUCES DEMOLITION WASTE,
 CONSERVES EMBODIED ENERGY
- INTEGRATES CONTEMPORARY NEEDS INTO HISTORIC FABRICS, MAINTAINING ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL INTEGRITY
- PROMOTES CULTURAL CONTINUITY WHILE REDUCING PRESSURE FOR NEW DEVELOPMENT



REFRAMING HERITAGE AS A CATALYST FOR URBAN TRANSFORMATION



- HERITAGE CAN SHAPE INCLUSIVE REGENERATION, STIMULATE THE CREATIVE ECONOMY AND ANCHOR COMMUNITY IDENTITY.
- SHIFT FROM PRESERVATION-AS-FREEZE TO HERITAGE-AS-PROCESS
- UNESCO: HERITAGE SHOULD SUPPORT SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT, NOT JUST COMMEMORATE THE PAST
- HERITAGE IS INCREASINGLY USED TO BRAND CITIES, ATTRACT INVESTMENT BUT ALSO TENDS TO DE-PROBLEMATISE [OR CELEBRATE] CONSEQUENCES SUCH AS GENTRIFICATION


CLIMATE VULNERABILITIES OF HISTORIC CITIES

- MANY HERITAGE CITIES ARE ILL-EQUIPPED TO MANAGE CLIMATE RISKS LIKE FLOODING
- TENSIONS, SUCH AS MAINTAINING HISTORIC SKYLINES VS. INTEGRATING GREEN TECHNOLOGIES
- A DELICATE BALANCE BETWEEN HERITAGE PRESERVATION AND ADEQUATE CITY-WIDE INFRASTRUCTURE



OVER-DEPENDENCE ON TOURISM

- WORLD HERITAGE DESIGNATION OFTEN LEADS TO TOURISM-DRIVEN ECONOMIES
- COVID-19 REVEALED VULNERABILITY IN MONO-ECONOMIES
- DIVERSIFICATION IS CRUCIAL: CREATIVE INDUSTRIES, KNOWLEDGE ECONOMIES, CULTURAL PRODUCTION






SOCIAL SUSTAINABILITY AT RISK

- HERITAGE-LED RENEWAL OFTEN INCREASES SOCIO-SPATIAL INEQUALITY
- GENTRIFICATION, INFLATED RENTS, LOSS OF AMENITY...
- IN WORLD HERITAGE CITIES, A TENDENCY TO FIND RESIDENT POPULATION DECLINE, DISPLACEMENT AND TENSION BETWEEN TOURIST ACTIVITY AND DAILY LIFE ... OFTEN THIS IS FACILITATED BY PLANNING POLICY FRAMEWORKS THEMSELVES






THE COMMODIFICATION OF HERITAGE

- PROLIFERATION OF BOUTIQUE TOURISM
 ACCOMMODATION
- EROSION OF COMMUNITY NETWORKS AND
 DISPLACEMENT OF TRADITIONAL RESIDENTS AND
 LAND USES
- THE BENEFITS OF CULTURE-BASED REGENERATION ARE DISPROPORTIONATELY ENJOYED BY SPECIFIC POPULATION SEGMENTS





- DISPLACEMENT OF RESIDENTS AND NEIGHBOURHOOD SHOPS





- VENICE: OVER 20M TOURISTS/YEAR ECOLOGICAL AND SOCIAL BURDEN
- BARCELONA: A SIGNIFICANT SHIFT IN PUBLIC OPINION AND POLITICAL STANCE TOWARDS TOURISM







COMPARATIVE CASES / PALMA DE MAJORCA

- RELIANCE ON TOURISM AS A SOURCE OF INCOME
- LUXURY BOUTIQUE HOTELS IN AREAS OF HIGH HISTORICAL VALUE, RADICALLY TRANSFORMING EXISTING NEIGHBOURHOODS







VALLETTA – A CITY UNDER PRESSURE

- EUROPEAN CAPITAL OF CULTURE (2018) CATALYSED RAPID INVESTMENT
- REGENERATION INITIATIVES PRIORITISED ECONOMIC RETURN
- RISE IN BOUTIQUE HOTELS, NIGHTLIFE VENUES, OUTDOOR CATERING AREAS
- DECLINE IN RESIDENT SERVICES AND LIVEABILITY







PLANNING POLICY GAPS

- VALLETTA STRATEGY (2016)
 AND LAND USE PERMITS
 FACILITATED
 COMMERCIALISATION
- LACK OF HOLISTIC VISION PRIORITISING LIVEABILITY
- POLICIES HAVE STRUGGLED TO REGULATE CONFLICTING LAND USES





GOVERNANCE AND PARTICIPATION

- URBAN GOVERNANCE MUST BE COLLABORATIVE AND TRANSPARENT
- LIVEABILITY IN WORLD HERITAGE CITIES IS ABOUT CREATING A CITY WHERE PEOPLE CAN THRIVE
- A BALANCE BETWEEN BUILT HERITAGE, SOCIAL EQUITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY
- WELL-INTEGRATED URBAN DESIGN POLICIES, WORKING WITH HERITAGE OBJECTIVES, CAN FOSTER INCLUSIVITY AND SUPPORT A MORE EQUITABLE URBAN FABRIC

- CAP SHORT-TERM RENTALS AND INCENTIVISE LONG-TERM HOUSING
- INVEST IN LIVEABILITY-ENHANCING INFRASTRUCTURE
