Dr. Kevin Murray, son of Rotarian Rick Murray, was guest speaker at the March 26, 2014 meeting of the Rotary Club of Mission Viejo. Dr. Murray shared details of his recent humanitarian trip to Swaziland. He was part of a medical team from Loma Linda University. The team was composed of ten medical professionals intent on improving health in the community in which they visited.

Dr. Murray shared some staggering statistics; e.g., 1) the communities of Swaziland are critically affected by HIV and AIDS; 2) current life expectancy is 50 years; 3) 50% of the children are HIV positive; etc.



The presentation was very interesting and informative. Members look forward to hearing updates as Dr. Murray moves forward in his own dental practice and leads/joins other humanitarian trips abroad.

MINUTES TO THE MEETING OF THE BOARD

President Ken called the meeting to order at 7:00 am and presided. The Board met in the Conference Room at Mission Viejo City Hall.

Minutes Approved: The Board approved the Minutes of the February regular meeting.

Secretary's Report:

Our attendance for December was 81%. Year-to-date, we are also running at 81%.

Director Dave Leckness offered to write a letter to Emily May terminating her membership for lack of attendance. The Board approved.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer Bill presented a Financial Statement for the club of Rotary Year 2013-14 year-to-date. It showed income of \$66,428.44, expenses of \$64,227.42, and \$2,201.02 of net income. We have \$75,762 in the Endowment Fund and another \$31,502 in our Operating Account. We have \$5,913 in receivables.

In February, our breakfast meal expenses slightly exceeded our member payment for meals. We had a short month and a large number of young attendees who were comp'd.

The Board approved a \$750 deposit to reserve the Lew Webb Car Museum for our Demotion Dinner on June 18, 2014. Director Eric reported that the total cost for 60 people will be \$2,416. Last year, we charged \$45 per attendee, and our expenses did not cover all costs at the Arroyo Trabuco Country Club. A discussion ensued about limiting expenses for recognition items. Treasurer Bill reported that Union Bank requested formal notification of signatories on the club's operating account. This is especially significant because IRS reported a mix-up on our EIN (Employer Identification Number). The Board voted to authorize William Kersten (Treasurer), Robert McQueen (Club Service Chair and Backup Treasurer), and David C. Williams (Secretary) to sign checks on behalf of the club. The Board further voted to require 2 signatures on checks exceeding \$1,000 in value. Our authorized EIN is now 23-7394267. We have typically not held meetings immediately in advance of special events, such as the Mayor's Prayer Breakfast, the Annual Fundraiser, and the Demotion Dinner, in order to encourage attendance. The amounts that Rotarians have paid in advance for the regular canceled meetings could then be applied to the event. However, the Prayer Breakfast and Annual Fundraiser this year fall on sequential weeks. The Board voted to go dark for our meetings on April 30, 2014 (for the Prayer Breakfast) and on June 18, 2014 (for the Demotion Dinner), but to hold our regular meeting on May 7, 2014 (in advance of the Fundraiser).

At the request of Director Gary, the Board approved \$200 in support of the Peace Conference, sponsored by the South Orange County Rotary Clubs on March 22, 2014.

Club Service:

Director Eric reported that the site for the annual fundraiser on May 10, 2014, has been changed to the Mission Viejo Country Club (MVCC). The goal is Net Income of \$15,000, but Eric is hoping for \$20,000. The club has offered sponsors at the \$600 or higher level an ad on our website for a year. Rotarian Millard Roth, Dentist, has agreed to be a sponsor at \$600. Eric has already approached our sponsors from last year about doing so again.

President's Report: UNFINISHED BUSINESS

President-Elect Paul offered to meet with the new General Manager of MVCC about displaying a plaque for the Rotary Club of Mission Viejo. President Ken and Director Dave Leckness will join him.

Director Dave Leckness reviewed plans for the Mayor's Prayer breakfast at MVCC on May 1, 2014 (7:30-9:00 am). The Board approved a ticket charge of \$30. (We came up about \$900 short last year.) We expect 120-150 participants. The committee is reviewing ticket control. It is complicated because groups buy tables without indicating who will be permitted to use them. He has approached Waste Management about sponsorship (at \$1,000). Mike Maiolo, Senior Pastor of Mission Viejo Christian Church, will preside. The plan is to allow 30-second messages in various languages and denominations from other religious leaders in the community (with translations where necessary). The music will have an African influence. Director Dave is preparing Save the Date flyers and will prepare invitations.

Jack Jones asked that speakers not be permitted to solicit money from members during their presentations. After discussion, the Board chose to have Program Chair Scott Walker inform speakers of the policy. They may, of course, make written requests to the Board and convey a website address to attendees who may wish to contribute.

NEW BUSINESS

PDG Jack Jones is arranging a group excursion to the meeting of the Rotary Club of Los Angeles (LA 5) on March 21, 2014 (noon to 1:30 pm). The group will travel by train and Metro and hear a presentation by Brad Pitt's father.

President Ken encouraged all Rotarians to fill out a Survey Form, passed out at our last meeting by PDG Jack Jones. President Ken suggested a spring social event of some type involving spouses and partners. April presents the fewest conflicts. He offered to hold it at his home (possibly on April 26, 2014). We might consider another Flash Mob at a local restaurant or another Fireside meeting. President-Elect Paul and Director Dave Leckness volunteered to meet and provide a plan. President-Elect Paul reported that Friends of the Arts might donate \$5,000 towards a Symphony on the Green on July 26, 2014. He said that he would keep the Board posted.

Membership Report:

Chair Jim attended the District Assembly on March 1, 2014, along with President-Elect Paul, and Bulletin Editor Jim Hansen. One of the messages he brought home was that 45% of new members leave Rotary within 2 years. This will require Rotary clubs to give added emphasis to retention.

Jack Jones has been doing exit interviews and will continue to follow up on absenteeism.

Youth Service:

President Ken reported that we have not found a replacement Youth Service Director. Director Dennis offered to continue responding to Youth Service concerns until a new Director can be appointed.

We still have not lined up students whom we are sponsoring to RYLA (April 25-27, 2014 at Idyllwild). Director Dennis will contact last year's Youth Service Director Bob Brown for guidance.

Other: The next Board meeting is scheduled for April 10, 2014.
