Veronica Wright-Stephens, President of Action Force Network, presented during the April 8, 2015 regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Mission Viejo. Her topic was, "Human Trafficking!"

Ms. Wright-Stephens shared details of the "Fastest growing crime in America." She told the audience 30,000 to 40,000 girls are smuggled into America each year as "Sex Slaves." She went on to say that the average age of girls being smuggled is from 12 years-old to 14 years-old. The "business" generates \$32 billion a year; that is \$87 million a day.

Ms. Wright-Stephens organization is advocating for more meaningful laws, a stronger court system, and better education for parents and children.
