Sister, Can You Spare A Dime?

In the 1930s, during the Great Depression, there was a popular song appealing to the population to be generous in helping those in need. Somehow in the back of my mind came the title of this song which was, "Brother, Can You Spare A Dime?"

Then I thought about Rotary's Sister or Twin club network between participating countries. And then the thought came to me from my own Rotary International Service experience that many of the clubs in other lands - like India, Mexico, Columbia - who became sister clubs could not carry out community projects, (especially financially), without the help of clubs like my own who are in a better position financially and or talent-wise to share by networking with a club we call "Sister Clubs" and who really are looking for a club to "spare a dime" and/or talents to help them carry out worthwhile projects locally; especially for the poorest of poor. I found this networking also produced A Rotary Friendship Exchange between two countries.

For over twenty five years I have observed many clubs in District 5320 who have spared many a dime and talent to help work with "Sister Clubs" in other countries. I have participated in some of these projects. Our clubs in our district have done such good projects as building artificial limbs, providing sewing machines, building water dams, building homes, providing food and shelter during natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, or lack of medical supplies. Many of these actions would have been hindered or non-existent without the help of a sister club outside of the U.S.A. One great tool is the Matching Global Grants which becomes a "magic wand" in bringing fully in to fruition the goals sought.

Reader, might I suggest that you examine your own club and see about planning a project you can team up with other groups in the Rotary family and widen the area of your projects to make a better impact even though you may already have one or more Sister clubs.

Please keep in mind that there are loads of clubs in other countries including our adjacent neighbor south of the border pleading, "Sister, can You Spare a Dime?"
