During that time he has been associated with four clubs: Syracuse, NY; Rotary One Chicago, IL; Mount Prospect, IL and, currently, Mission Viejo, CA. Each month, George writes an article for the Rotarian, a District 5320 publication. This is one of those articles.

ROTARY PRAYER BREAKFAST

If you are looking for an unusual, but gratifying, service to your community, you may follow in the footsteps of the National Prayer Breakfast held each May in Washington D.C. This is exactly what my club did some twenty five years ago. The year was 1988 and a member of our club was also serving on the City of Mission Viejo's City Council. He (PP William Craycraft) thought it would be a great Community Service project that would allow local leaders and citizens an opportunity to express honor, respect and support for our community. We named it the Rotary Club of Mission Viejo Annual Mayor's Prayer Breakfast. The current mayor of Mission Viejo is the guest of honor each year.

The Mayor's Prayer Breakfast is held each year on the first Thursday of May - the same day as the National Day of Prayer. The current president of our club always opens the meeting by giving a short summary of what Rotary is all about. This is followed by the Invocation (usually by a Clergy). Then a flag presentation from either the Boy of our Scouts of America or from a military Guard of Event!



of Allegiance. We then ask the current mayor of our city to welcome all and give an address. Then a scripture reading is done by a Rotarian from our club. Each year we invite a pastor, from one of our local churches or temples, who prays for the community, state and nation. This is followed by a soloists from one of our local high schools. Then our main speaker is introduced and is usually a local Pastor. We invite a member of the clergy to do the Benediction and the closing is a song led by a Rotarian and sung by all. We use the same song each year titled, "Let There Be Peace on Earth."

During the Breakfast we also honor special citizens who are serving our community such as members of the police department, fire department, and other community services. We also always invite the current district governor. We have always held our Breakfast at the Mission Viejo Country Club - a wonderful setting and an excellent breakfast is served.

Each member of our club sells tickets to the event to help cover the costs and ensure members of our community are aware of this meaningful event!
