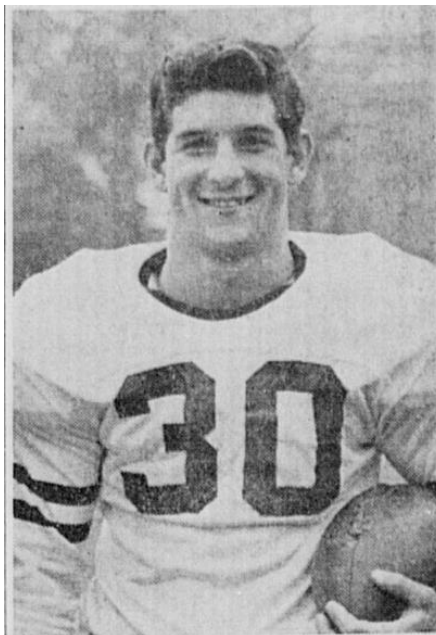

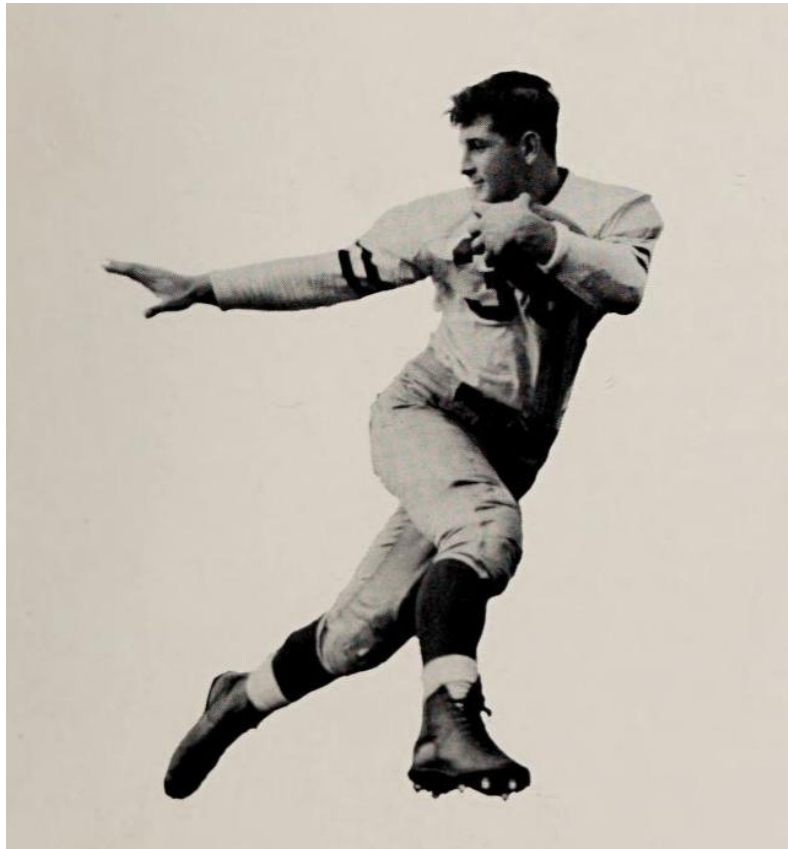

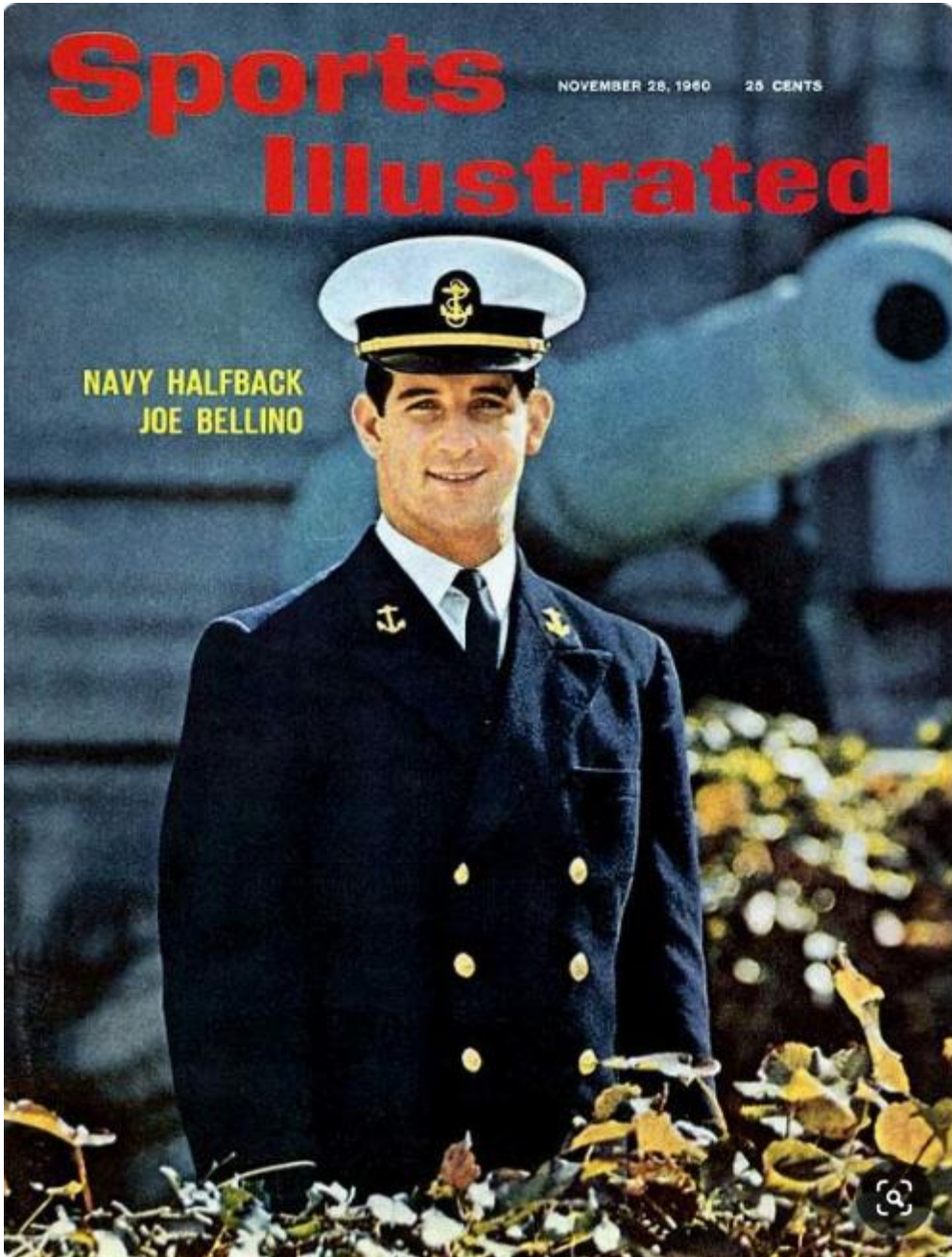

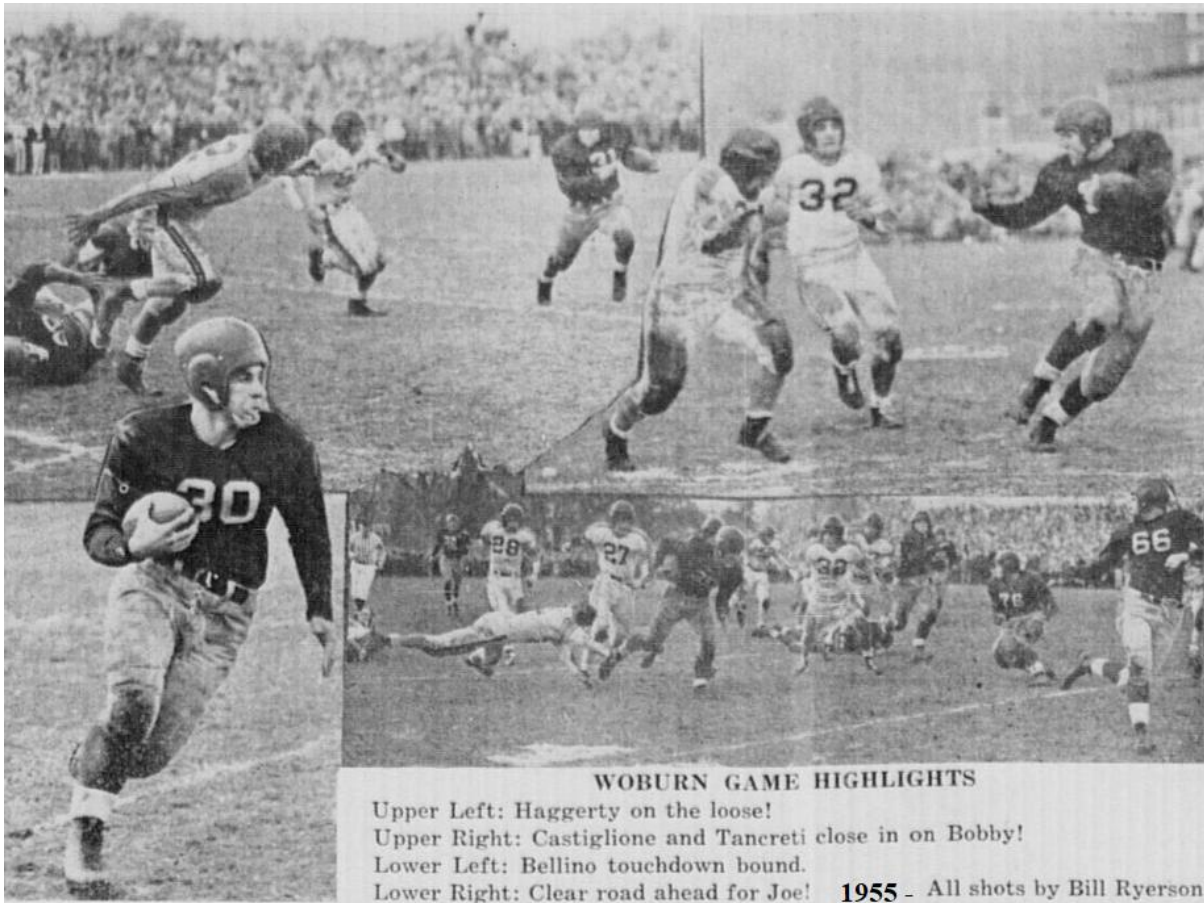

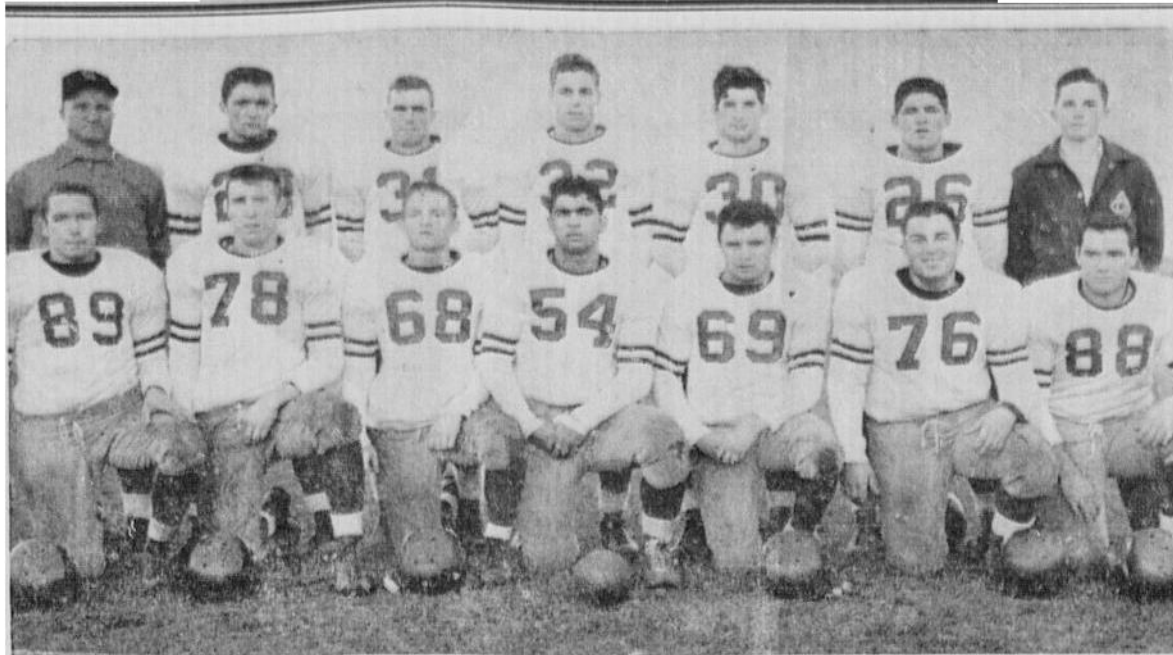

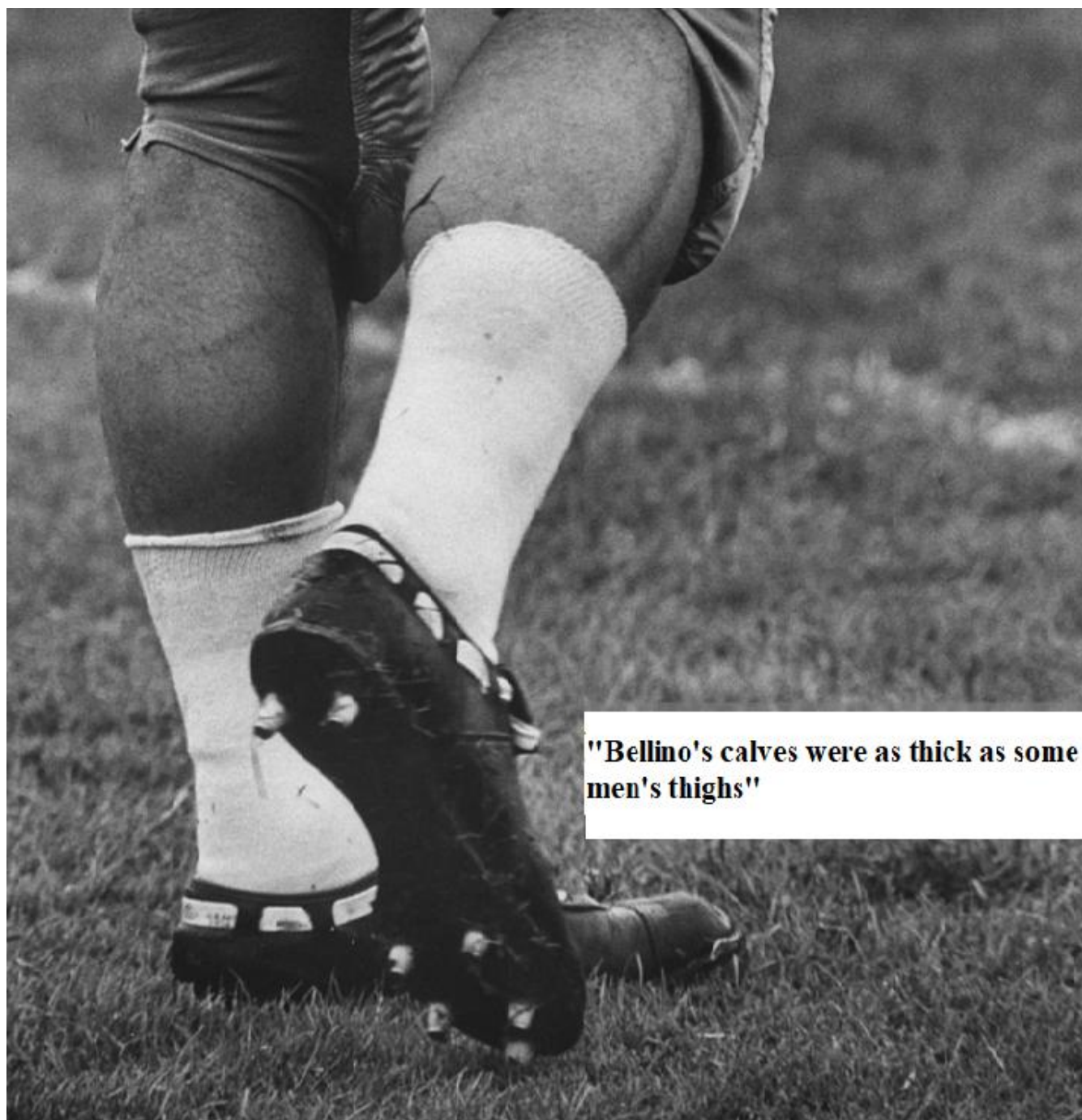

Although the captain, Nick Triantafilou, was unable to play because of a neck injury, he worked with our excellent coaches, Mr. Dorrington, Mr. Corleto, Mr. White, and Mr. Murray, building up and sparking the team to eight wins and one tie. These victories brought us the Northeastern Conference Championship and the championship of Class C. 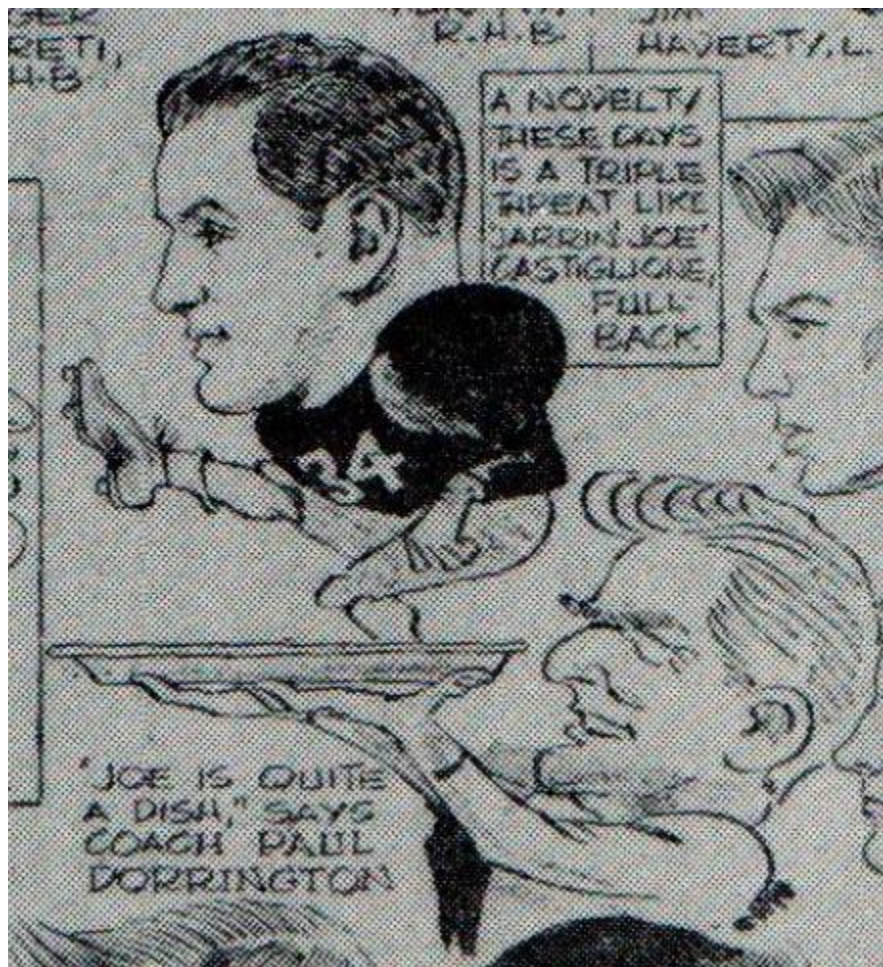

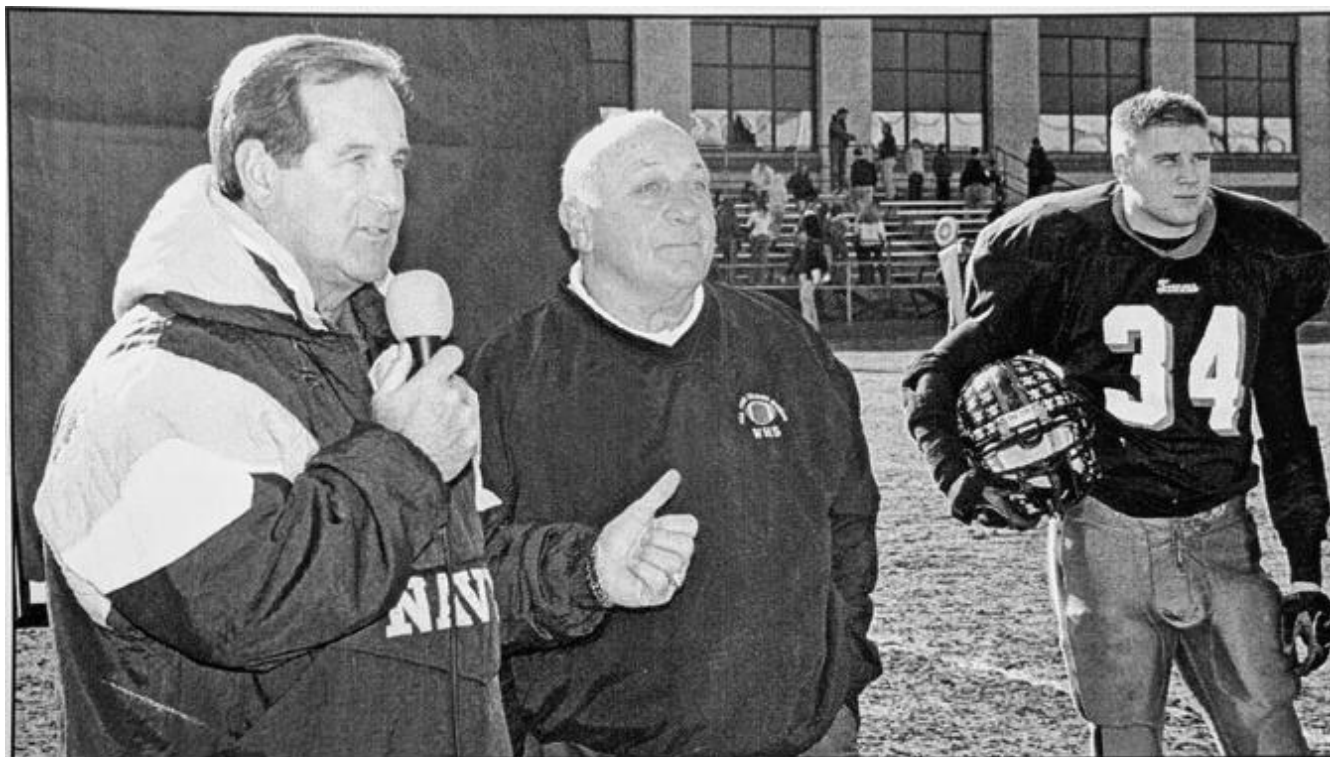
boy ranks, scored two touchdowns as Woburn defeated Winchester in the game between previously unbeaten teams.

"I CAN'T BELIEVE IT'S BEEN 49 YEARS," said Winchester's Joe Bellino (l) as Joe Castiglione's (c) number was retired. Bellino noted that he couldn't "really remember that 65 yard run I made here back in 1954," however, he said he will always remember "the will and determination of Joe Castiglione on that day." Bellino, a former Heisman Trophy winner, was on the short end of the 18-13 score which gave Woburn a state Class C championship and denied Winchester a Class B championship. Both were undefeated going into the game and Bellino and Castiglione have been close friends over the years. Woburn defensive back David Ralli is at right.
