One of the first actions of the Foundation Board was to create a new Foundation senior administrative position to address issues dealing with government agencies and laws relating to charitable nonprofit organizations. On July 1, 2021, Carl J. Kosnar was appointed by the Foundation Board as In-House Counsel to assist with regulatory matters.

The combined mission of both the Solana Beach ECO Rotary Foundation and Rotary Club is, "To educate ourselves and our communities about environmental challenges and engage in implementing their solutions."

In pursuit of its mission, both the Foundation and Club are advocates for causes and activities that support a healthy environment. This includes addressing concerns for environmental protection and the impact of climate change on humans, animals, and plants.

Supporting the environment became Rotary International's new seventh area of focus, which includes categories of service activities supported by global grants. It joins peacebuilding and conflict prevention; disease prevention and treatment; water, sanitation, and hygiene; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and community economic development. The Foundation management team believes that providing grant funds to help improve global humanitarian needs is one of the most exciting ways to scale social impact.
