JIM BIDDLE NEWS AT NOON by Betty Waznis



Hello, everyone, and welcome to today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon. Today brought to you by Risa Baron and Republic Services.

On Wednesday the president paused tariffs on goods from many countries for 90 days. Many goods from most countries will still be subject to a 10% tariff until then. No changes were made to agreements previously made for Canada and Mexico, and certain other sector carveouts. At the same time, tariffs on Chinese-made goods were raised to 125%. The pause does not apply to the 25% tariffs on steel and aluminum levied in March, on autos that started on April 3 and auto parts to be effective May 3.

Current results in the District 1 Supervisor race show Chula Vista Mayor John McCann in first place with a44% of the vote, and Imperial Beach Mayor Paloma Aguirre at 32%. Since it is not expected that either candidate will get 50%, a final runoff election between the two is expected July 1. Voter turnout was just under 17% of 373,000-plus registered voters, with more than 62,000 ballots counted as of last night. District 1 voters overwhelmingly preferred mail-in ballots, submitting more than 60,000 of them, compared to vote center ballots totaling just under 1900.

For the second year in a row, Trader Joe's has brought a sales frenzy to its stores, with customers waiting in line, sometimes even camping out, to buy miniature tote bags bearing the grocery chain's logo for \$2.99. The sensation began a year ago when, without much notice, Trader Joe's released its first series of limited-edition totes, basically just smaller versions of the reusable canvas bags that the chain has sold for years. The totes became a trendy must-have accessory, and the stampede began. This year, there was a bit more warning, and stores were prepared for the chaos organizing lines, and restricting purchase amounts. On Wednesday, a few of the new bags were already listed for up to \$70 on eBay.

The Padres became the first team in the Majors to reach 10 wins this season with their 2-1 victory Wednesday over the A's in a tense series finale to win the series 2 games to 1. The games were played at Sacramento's Sutter Health Park minor league field where the former Oakland A's will play until their new Las Vegas stadium is completed in a couple of years. The Padres were playing without three of their starters – Jackson Merrill, Fernando Tatis Jr., and Jake Cronenworth. -- Merrill officially on the injured list and the other two benched in a watch and wait situation. With or without them, the Padres will open a six-game homestand tonight at 6:40 - three games against the Rockies followed by three games against the Cubs.

Our sponsor, Risa Baron, is a New York native who moved with her family to California after high school. Once she experienced January in San Diego, she never wanted to leave. Among her other accomplishments, she is past President of I Love a Clean San Diego and President of SDSU Alumni Association.




