JOHN SANDMEYER PREVENT DROWNING FOUNDATION Friday, August 23, 2024 - Noon



John Sandmeyer will tell us about the work of the Prevent Drowning Foundation. He worked for the San Diego Lifeguard Service for 38 years and retired as the Marine Safety Captain. He is currently employed with the City of San Diego Office of Emergency Services as an Emergency Manager. As a Lifeguard, John oversaw all Lifeguard and Mission Bay Harbor Patrol training including the San Diego County Lifeguard Regional Training Academy.

He was the Swiftwater/Flood Rescue Team Leader for San Diego Fire-Rescue Department and directed the San Diego Junior Lifeguard program. He was a founding member of the SD Junior Lifeguard Foundation and currently leads the Water Emergency Preparedness workgroup for the California Water Safety Coalition.

John has coordinated training with Baja California lifeguards for over 20 years and is an instructor for the Surf Lifesaving del Sur Team in Cabo San Lucas. John enjoys his free time with his family, works on improving his Spanish and travels whenever he can to increase his experience in and out of the water.

Assistant District Governor (ADG) Michael Monaco had an update on the Chula Vista-Eastlake Rotary Club Sip N Sail event. Due to unforeseen circumstances, they had to bump the date to Sunday, August 25 with a different ship.

In his role as Fine Master, Michael fined Suzanne for yet another broken (fractured) bone - this time in her left foot—an injury sustained by rigorous gardening. Hello, everyone and welcome to today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at noon. Today brought to you by Kimberley Marshall.

The 2024 Paris Olympics were quite a success for San Diego. Sixty-five athletes with local ties — whether raised here, went to school here or live here currently — competed in the Summer Games, and they're returning home with 27 total medals from 12 different sports. Five won gold, including Jennifer Valente from Scripps Ranch who won two golds in track cycling. Four got silver. Seventeen got bronze, including the 12-woman U.S. rugby sevens team that is based at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center. Or look at it this way: Excluding medals won as part of a larger team with athletes from elsewhere, and counting medals from a two-person event as a half, San Diego County (population 3.3 million) as its own country would rank 21st in the Paris medals table with 10.

Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass arrived early Monday afternoon at LAX with the official Olympic flag. Bass received the flag at Sunday's Paris Olympics Closing Ceremony from Paris Mayor Anne Hidalgo in a first-ever exchange between two female mayors. The flag, which will be housed at Los Angeles City Hall, will be raised at the main venue during the Opening Ceremony at the 2028 Olympics, the third hosted by Los Angeles. Plans are already being worked out for the numerous venues needed for the massive event. SDSU's Snapdragon Stadium, in Mission Valley, is currently listed as a potential venue for Olympic soccer group matches and quarterfinals.

Annual inflation cooled more than expected last month, to 2.9 percent, according to a Consumer Price Index report released Wednesday. It was the first time that the inflation gauge had dropped below 3 percent since 2021. According to a Fed Reserve Bank president, "While inflation is down, prices are still high and consumers have gotten to the point where they're just not accepting it. And that's what you want: The solution to high prices is high prices." Some of America's largest companies, from Amazon to Disney to Taco Bell, say their customers are seeking cheaper alternatives, searching for bargains, or just avoiding items they find too expensive.

COVID-19 is once again back in the headlines. We're seeing a summer surge with a positivity rate at nearly the highest it has ever been. San Diego County's positivity rate is the second highest ever recorded, close to 21%, while the state and nationwide rate is closer to 14% The strength of this summer's COVID surge is largely related to the highly infectious subvariants that continue to emerge as the coronavirus evolves.

While hospitalizations overall remain low, emergency room, clinic and doctor visits have been rising. And the number of people who have never had COVID-19 — the "Novids" — is dwindling, with reports of people who didn't get any COVID until this point, now in its fifth year.

The San Diego Padres thrashed Pittsburgh again on Wednesday afternoon at Petco Park, an 8-2 demolition to complete a sixgame season-series sweep of the Pirates -- all within a nine-day span. It marked the Padres' 19th victory in their past 22 games -- the first time in franchise history they've done that. A night earlier, they equaled a franchise record from 2007 by clinching an eighth straight series win. The Padres are tied for the top wild-card playoff spot in the National League with 42 regular season games remaining. Next up: a stretch of 18 games in 18 days beginning tonight with a three game away series against the Rockies.

The 27th Annual Lemon Festival in downtown Chula Vista will be held tomorrow from 11 am to 6 pm. Third Avenue will be filled with all things lemon as part of a celebration of CV's agricultural heritage Park. (Continue on page 5).
