ALEXANDRA KEEGAN East County Youth Symphony Friday, August 27, 2021—Noon



East County Youth Symphony, led by Music Director and Conductor Alexandra Keegan, is the most advanced music program in East San Diego County. Our young musicians (average age 14) meet the challenges of professional discipline, preparing for rehearsals, thoughtful and productive practicing, and original (not adapted for easy learning) repertoire.

Membership in East County Youth Symphony is absolutely free, there are no fees or tuition required. It's open to all musicians, ages 7 to 25, who wish to audition. Current members range from relative beginners to some of San Diego County's finest young musicians and come from 39 different schools.

Every musician in East County Youth Symphony upper divisions performs in a Symphony Orchestra. In addition, participation in ensembles and/or Chamber Orchestra is encouraged. All ECYS programs and ensembles are absolutely free.

The East County Youth Symphony orchestras rehearse weekly and perform 8-10 concerts a year, while the Chamber Orchestra and Ensembles perform year round at a variety of venues.

Good afternoon Rotarians and guests. Welcome to the Jim Biddle News at Noon. Today's news sponsored by Donna Moss and LPL Financial.

Well, we have our choice of troubles this week. As of yesterday, the US had evacuated some 12000 people from Kabul after the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan.

Closer to home, the Caldor Fire in El Dorado and Amador Counties joins the Dixie Fire and more than 14 current major fire outbreaks in Northern California. 11,000 fire fighters are on the front lines. 31,000 people in seven counties are under evacuation orders. More than 13 million California acres have burned this year. And from the country that can't catch a break, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake hit Haiti last weekend, killing close to two thousand and leaving many more thousands homeless. This was followed shortly by the arrival of Tropical Storm Grace, bringing rain, storm winds, flooding and landslides.

On a brighter note, the Rady Shell opened to great success and thrilled audiences on August 6. The beautiful new concert venue for the San Diego Symphony has a musical lineup that offers something for everyone – from Beethoven to Gladys Knight. Its spectacular bayside location on the Embarcadero is meant to operate year-round, taking advantage of our climate and promoting a healthy outdoor experience. Concerts are currently scheduled through November and include all kinds of popular and classical favorites. See what's ahead at **theshell.org**.

Addressing a desperate need for starting pitchers due to injuries, the Padres signed Jake Arrieta on Monday. Arrieta, a former 2015 Cy Young winner who fell on hard times, was released by the Chicago Cubs last week.

Arrieta started Wednesday against the Rockies and lasted four innings before he left the mound with a left hamstring injury. Padres fell to the Rockies 7 to 5 to conclude the series. The loss leaves the Padres in third place in the National League West, clinging to a 1 game lead over the Reds in the race for the league's second and final wild card spot. Next up - Padres vs Phillies tonight at Petco Park.
