Vendors and small businesses at Otay Ranch Market are struggling to operate amid a drastic decline in customers because of COVID-19 concerns. Having closed in March, the market reopened in July, but the decrease in foot traffic is hurting some of its businesses.

The Otay Ranch Market has put safety measures in place since reopening, including installing handwashing stations and separating vendors by at least 8 feet.

Since its debut in 2007, the Market has been an integral part of the culture of Otay Ranch and Eastlake on Tuesday nights, especially during the summer.

Some community members are working to show their support, and encourage others to do the same. Katia Callahan started the Facebook group "Eastlake Food to Go" to bring her community together and support local restaurants and vendors.

Despite the lower numbers, the market will continue Tuesdays from 4 to 7 p.m., at the Otay Ranch Town Center.



The Chula Vista Firefighters' Foundation was the vision of a retired CVFD Captain. It's mission is to serve the community through numerous partnerships and targeted programs. The focus is on disaster relief, water safety initiatives, Adopt a Family and provide grocery gift cards to residents in need—and more. The Foundation partners with *Southwestern College* by providing equipment for their community CPR classes and also provides scholarships to students.

Rotarians asked about volunteer opportunities and Sean said there are several during normal times. Some events such as the Easter Egg Hunt and pancake breakfast were cancelled. The Vulcan Quarry 5k/10K is a fun and challenging event that helps to support their work.

Some members expressed an interest in reviving the Rotary community service activity of installing smoke detectors in mobile homes and the homes of seniors. We will follow up on that.

The Fire Academy at Paseo Ranchero and East H, which serves as a training hub for local and regional departments, may be the site of a future Rotary Club meeting or event – stay tuned!
