Born in Missouri, Ms. Baker experienced segregation and discrimination, fleeing to France as a young woman, she found, as she said, "freedom and dignity." Josephine Baker is the first African American woman to be entombed at the Pantheon, France's hallowed tomb of heroes. She is one of only five women honored at the Pantheon and the first person of American origin to be laid to rest there.


