Brandon will share with us a vision for how we move from our politically, racially, and economically divided culture towards one of empathy and trust. He will present the latest research on our current state of affairs and best practices for healing a divided culture. You'll also learn about his work at Unity Lab, and how we can embrace an ethos of active citizenship to create a stronger, kinder, and more resilient San Diego.

Brandon is a Midwesterner, best-selling author, impact entrepreneur, and expert in social learning + culture change. Prior to founding Unity Lab, he worked at two leading social learning companies, Ion and Imperative, to activate empathy, trust, belonging, purpose, and leadership at scale. He is trusted as a keynote speaker, consultant, and program leader by organizations such as Google, Johnson & Johnson, Stanford University, Morgan Stanley, U.S. Marine Corps, University of California - Berkeley, LinkedIn, the U.S. Navy, Slalom Consulting, the U.S. Coast Guard, and the University of Minnesota.

Strong, dry Santa Ana winds gusted up to 80 mph yesterday in San Diego County's Cuyamaca Mountains and 50 mph to 60 mph in some foothill communities, causing wind damage and a small but fast moving fire in Rancho San Diego that destroyed one home and damaged six.

The relative humidity is expected to drop into single digits in some places today as the hot dry weather continues. A red-flag fire weather warning will be in effect until 6 p.m. on Saturday for the eastern half of the county. On Wednesday, San Diego Gas & Electric notified more than 90,000 customers — many living in backcountry areas — that they could lose power in the coming days in a series of planned outages. SDG&E advises customers that it's always a good time to keep all your devices charged.

SDSU has joined other universities in cancelling spring break to minimize travel and large gatherings. In exchange, students get 4 R&R days spread throughout the semester

The San Diego State Aztecs are knocking on the door of the AP top 25, coming in at number 27 in Monday's poll of NCAA men's basketball. SDSU was originally supposed to host Colorado State yesterday and tomorrow to open their Mountain West schedule, but the Rams paused practice for two weeks after two positive COVID-19 cases. Not wanting to go 13 days before a game against No. 25 Arizona State, Coach Brian Dutcher called the St Katherine's Firebirds, even if that meant playing an NAIA opponent the Aztecs beat 118-35 when they met in 2013. Final score Wednesday was 83-41. Next up is Pepperdine on Sunday afternoon.

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MEETING HIGHLIGHTS—DECEMBER 4, 2020 (Continued)


Guest speaker Marlon King, Emergency Services Coordinator, provided a detailed overview of his activities on behalf of the city of Chula Vista.


