Hi Team,

I am grateful for this partnership and want to give you a little taste of what it's like for our families to have this support.

Today, I provided a gift card to a single mother with four young children. The mother lost her housing due to an increase in rent one month ago. The family is currently staying at a motel while they seek permanent housing. Mom has a full-time job, but due to the increasing costs and expenses associated with their motel stay, she is struggling to buy food for her children. When I gave her the gift card, she received it, held it to her heart, and gave me a firm "thank you." She didn't say more than that, and I could tell she was holding back tears.

Yesterday, we gave a gift card to another one of our families composed of a single father diagnosed with cerebral palsy raising a young girl currently in the 5th grade. This family is also staying in a motel. The father is employed full time by Sea World. He makes a two-hour journey to work on the bus daily. Although he holds full-time employment, the father is struggling to make ends meet and shared that he often feels like he has to choose between paying for their motel or food. He is grateful for the gift card and plans to use it to treat his daughter to a nice thanksgiving meal.
