

As we celebrate love today, remind us of the deep bonds of service and caring we share as Rotarians in our own club as well as with others all around the world. Amen and Shalom





MEETING HIGHLIGHTS—FEBRUARY 12, 2021


MORE MEETING HIGHLIGHTS—FEBRUARY 12, 2021


