Behavioral health is one of the most significantly underfunded and under-addressed issues we have nationally, in the state of California, and in our communities. The need for inpatient behavioral health beds in our community is great and has become more critical during the coronavirus pandemic.

With so many in our community facing economic insecurity, social isolation, and constant health and safety concerns, there has been a significant increase in the number of people experiencing depression, anxiety, and other behavioral health issues.

To respond to this need, Scripps Health has entered into a joint venture with Acadia Healthcare to significantly expand quality behavioral health services to patients in our area.

The two health care organizations are proposing to develop and jointly operate a new, state-of-the-art 120-bed behavioral health hospital in Eastlake. This facility will provide safe, quality care and criticallyneeded inpatient bed capacity and intensive outpatient services for adults, teens, and seniors.

Good afternoon Rotarians and guests, and good afternoon to our speaker, George Gillow. Today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon is sponsored by Laura Humphreys and the South Bay Family YMCA.

Nationwide winter storms are forcing temporary shutdowns of some local vaccination clinics. The main manufacturing facilities for the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are in Massachusetts and Michigan. The disruption in supply and transportation lines have resulted in a backlog of 6 million doses affecting all 50 states. Result is temporary closure of some sites, with others restricting vaccines for second doses only. It's expected to take three days to resolve the backlog.

NASA's rover Perseverance landed safely yesterday on Mars to begin an ambitious mission to search for signs of past Martian life and obtain samples of soil and rock. Perseverance, the first multibillion-dollar NASA mission to Mars in nine years, safely landed in the target area, an ancient lakebed known as Jezero Crater. The rover was guided into the spot by a suite of navigational instruments, including a camera built by Malin Space Science Systems of Sorrento Valley, one of five cameras from the San Diego company on board the craft.

Laura Muñoz Humphreys is currently the Executive Director of the South Bay Family and Eastlake YMCAs. Laura was born in Medellin, Colombia, and moved with her family to Miami when she was 3 years old. She has been involved with the YMCA for over 30 years, beginning as a teen in the YMCA's youth leadership program.

The San Diego Padres and its star shortstop Fernando Tatis Jr. agreed to terms on a 14-year contract, the longest in MLB history. Its \$340 million value is the third richest overall behind recent deals signed by Mike Trout and Mookie Betts.




## Few Acres Dairy Farm

  - The Dairy was renamed Eaton Dairy and closed in 1975.


