The seventh General Manager of Sweetwater Authority (S/A), Tish Berge, is a professional chemical engineer overseeing more than 130 employees at their headquarters in Chula Vista. Its board is made of elected and appointed officials from both National City and Chula Vista. Their water source is the Loveland and Sweetwater dams. One-fourth of the water they distribute to the Bonita and western Chula Vista areas is bought from other sources. The customers of S/A are the most efficient in the county in their water use, making the financial pressures on the business a little more manageable. Rates for buying water have increased 22% , offset somewhat by the Reynolds Desalination Plant producing 10 million gallons a day from several ground wells in Chula Vista. That plant was named after another general manager of S/A and a former Chula Vista Rotarian. Planning is in work to replace their main pipe (over 100 years old) and installing a back-up to support businesses along Bonita Road.
