JIM BIDDLE NEWS AT NOON



Good afternoon Rotarians and guests. Today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon is sponsored by Chuck Bevan and the Sweetwater Valley Lines, HO Railroad.

Beginning Tuesday, most of California's mask rules imposed during the COVID-19 pandemic —stores, gyms, and restaurants — will disappear for those who are fully vaccinated. California will align with recommendations from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that fully vaccinated people largely no longer need to mask up — with some exceptions that include transit, health care settings, K-12 schools and other youth facilities. By contrast, people not yet fully vaccinated will be required to wear masks in businesses and public indoor settings.

California has reached a vaccination rate of 71% of the adult population with at least one shot, joining 12 other states that have achieved the goal of a 70% rate by Independence Day.

The Padres have fallen into third place in the National League West for the first time since May 2, after the home series against the Cubs that concluded Wednesday, behind the second place Dodgers, and first place San Francisco Giants. They now travel to New York to face the Mets, with the first game starting today at 4:10.

Chuck Bevan joined Rotary in 1985 and became its President in 1996-97. He worked as Vice President of Sales in the Union Bank Business Trust Department for the San Diego region, his career following the growth of the popular 401k plan. After retirement from the bank in 2003 he went to work as the back office and official paper pusher for Jim Biddle at The Securities Center, retiring again in 2016.

Chuck now enjoys working on his '67 Mustang that he bought new, and operating his world famous Sweetwater Valley Lines HO railroad. He and his wife Marilyn enjoy visits to Colorado and their two grandchildren and flying to Chicago to say hi to daughter Carolyn and her husband Justin. In both cases, they are spoiled rotten.



COMMUNITY PROJECTS UPDATE



Amna Sanctuary is a 501 (c) (3) established in March 2020 by one of our newer Rotary members, Rasha Roshdy, to provide immigrants and refugees with the tools for personal success. One of the programs is "Support for Communities" which will empower immigrants with manual skills to earn money, through Amna's "Bless These Hands" program. They help participants get licensed to work in fields where they already have skills and experience from their country of origin.

In March 2021 C.V. Rotary provided \$500 to Amna Sanctuary for their "Bless These Hands" program to support two individuals to purchase a sewing machines and supplies to start their own individual sewing business. Marketing, sales and distribution contact support is also provided. Below are pics of the first woman who finished the training and got her sewing machine on May 20th. The second woman was scheduled to receive her machine a week later.


