Anya Delacruz introduced us to ElderCare , a business whose purpose is to help seniors to find affordable housing . Their niche is to connect seniors (or others) who have an extra room in their home and are willing to rent it to a senior who is in need of such accommodation. They do not build homes or manage homes, they instead do a great deal of background checking and counseling with the partners to this live-in home arrangement. The renter must abide by landlord laws . The business counsels by providing skills to help in the connection and they follow through long after to see that the arrangement stays good for both parties.

Eldercare has been in business for 40 years, primarily in Poway and San Diego, who have provided funding. They work with over 7,000 seniors a year. They are looking to expand in to South Bay and need about \$100,000 a year in funding to do so. They have 450 volunteers and 18 staff.
