




Meeting Highlights of May 29, 2020 (Continued)





KACHADOORIAN NAMED CHULA VISTA CITY MANAGER

The Chula Vista City Council has unanimously selected Maria Kachadoorian as the next City Manager. Kachadoorian is the first woman and first Latina to serve as City Manager of San Diego County's second largest City.

"Maria has the knowledge, skills and vision we need to move the City forward during these unprecedented times," said Chula Vista Mayor Mary Casillas Salas. "She brings to this critical position strong leadership skills, municipal finance acumen, and a passionate commitment to foster positive relationships with employees, residents, as well as with elected, business and community leaders."

Kachadoorian has worked at the City of Chula Vista for 22 years. She started in the Finance Department, advanced to Finance Director, before becoming Deputy then Assistant City Manager. Her strong finance background helped lead the City through the Great Recession and she will be instrumental in implementing innovative strategies to mitigate the financial, economic and community impacts to the City and residents from the COVID-19 pandemic.

As City Manager she will oversee and maintain a balanced budget, advance the Chula Vista Bayfront development, launch Ambulance Transport Services, and foster initiatives that better connect the City's diverse communities.

Kachadoorian is a long-time resident of South County and lives in Chula Vista. She was born in Tijuana and immigrated to the United States as an infant. She earned a Bachelor of Science Degree with an emphasis in Accounting and a Master's Degree in Public Administration from San Diego State University. She also is a Certified Public Accountant. As a Chula Vista Rotarian, she has volunteered on many projects benefiting the Chula Vista community.

Project Mercy Home Build Update

Our Club sent \$5000 for a home for the Torres Santana family. It is uncertain when the home will be built, however, we are hoping for early fall if restrictions are eased. We work with Project Mercy who coordinates construction materials and facilitates the selection of applicants. Our Club, friends, family and usually the Eastlake Rotary Club work together to construct a simple A-frame home, with a loft, living, and kitchen areas. We donate household items, food, paper goods and tools for the family. This is from the Torres Santana application submitted in January:


In Juana's own words: "We dream for a better home so that all of us in the family are together and much better off and that the children have their own space and some privacy. At the moment, the children are staying with Daniel's parents because of the condition of our current house so a decent home means we can once again live as a family.

Thank you. We don't have words to tell you how we feel. Thank you for helping needy families like us because our economic situation does not allow us to have a nice home."

Juana was born in San Luis Potosi and Daniel in Veracruz. Juana was brought to Tijuana by her parents and Daniel migrated there looking for work. Daughter Ilse is intelligent and wins educational awards in her school and she hopes to be a doctor. Carlos is inquisitive and likes to fix things; he wants to be a fireman. Jacob likes learning about nature and would like to be a policeman.

Juana and Daniel make money by scavenging in the local dump for recyclable materials and earn about 250 pesos a week (@\$14)*. In either case, their earnings are woefully insufficient to pay for basic household expenses and they live in very poor conditions.

The living conditions near the garbage dump are poor and the family is often sick. Juana has a tumor in her head. She has had 4 operations and needs another, but cannot afford it. Carlos is allergic to dust, and Jacob has a learning disability.
