Rotarian Chris Romero runs a one-man show and is the west coast regional manager for “The Outreach”. It is a program started by a couple in Iowa that packages nutritious meals that can then be sent to food banks and food pantries that feed the needy. He has partnered with many Rotary clubs and two Rotary districts to do fundraisers. Often a Rotary club will partner with other community organizations to leverage the effort.

A typical process involves a one hour prep, two hours of actual packaging and one hour of clean up. Often a Saturday morning is used so that the rest of the day is free for other pursuits. Our club has done something similar on our Rotary at Work Day with the Food Bank in San Diego. The meals this program produces often is coupled with fresh produce from the food bank to make a complete meal. It takes \$6,000 to package 20,000 meals.

This is a great way to involve young people in a concrete service project that directly helps the needy in the community. Just a small indicator is that there are 500,000 children in San Diego County that have food insecurity that can be helped by this program.
