Luis Lutteroth provided a very exciting project in the planning stages in Tijuana. It basically is an initiative with a public/private non-profit entity called CDT to build 12 parks in Tijuana that will be both beautiful and economically self-sustaining.

The group has surveyed several existing parks in urban areas in Central America and Mexico. They are primarily government run and therefore the costs of operations is vague. The CDT project will be groundbreaking in its design and its structure. Each park will have parking, concessions, event venues, restaurants, sports areas, bicycles, skateparks and a virtual reality pavilion. It will also have a lake. and other business that will contribute to its sustainability. It may have a solar panel component that will contribute to its autonomy. It will have separate areas for children, the disadvantaged and the aged. Each park will cost about \$9 million. Funding for over \$3 million is already established for the first park that will be in the southeastern part of the city and will serve over 700,000 people who live within one mile. There will be hospital and university facilities near-by. It is hoped to begin in 2019 and complete in 2022.


WHAT: The Innovation Station


