Former member and song leader, Paul Raffer, visited us and brought along a banner from his new Rotary Club in Palm Springs.



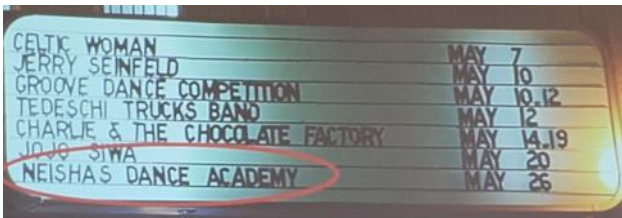
Past President Eric Rimmel was recognized for his sartorial splendor!



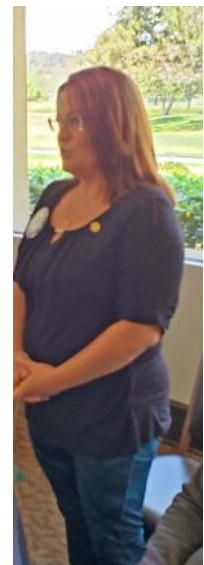
Michael Simonson will be collecting and disposing of old batteries on a monthly basis at our meetings.
