Olga Alvarez, current president of the Lawyers Club of San Diego, helped us to understand the mission and activities of her organization.

In 1972, when the organization was formed by 24 attorneys, women could not go to the Grant Grill and be served without being accompanied by a man. They staged a sit-in to change that policy. They created legislation to allow women to independently open a checking account.

Women in the legal profession earn 82 cents for every dollar earned by men. In 1964, that was 64 cents. There is still a long way to go.

While 50% of the law students are women, 50% of them leave the profession within 5 years. The pay rate worsens as women rise in their firms to higher positions.

Human trafficking is in all areas of San Diego. It is the second largest underground economy with 400-800 girls generating a \$800 million a year business. The organization is dedicated to education to combat this menace.

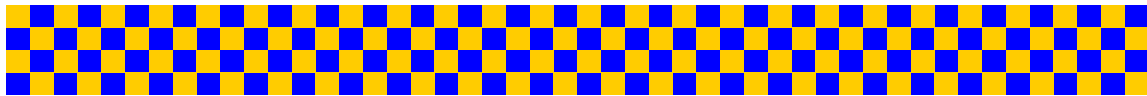
WHAT: The Innovation Station
