Darren Klassen has been part of the Torrey Pines Surf Ministry for over ten years. It started when members of the Torrey Pines Church, who are surfing enthusiasts decided to blend these two groups into a ministry that provides therapy for those in need by exposing them to the wonders of surfing.

Balboa Naval Hospital has actually prescribed their ministry and are in the process of validating their therapeutic results scientifically. It is called Recreational Therapy by the hospital.

They have two programs, one at La Jolla Shores and one at Del Mar. It is a six week program.

Darren described how the ministry has become accepted by the resident surfing community and changed the culture of the beach to be more open to those with disabilities.

Daren introduced Mike Spivey, a veteran who has become an integral part of the ministry. Mike has participated in the 2016 Paralympics and will be going to the 2024 Paralympics where surfing will be included.
