Good afternoon, Rotarians and guests. Welcome to the Jim Biddle News at Noon. Today's news sponsored by Maria Kachadoorian and the City of Chula Vista.

The world's most expensive lunch will go on sale again this spring when investor Warren Buffett auctions off a private meal to raise money for a California homeless charity one last time. The auction has been on hiatus for the past two years because of the pandemic. Buffett, the world-renowned CEO of Berkshire Hathaway, has held the lunch auction once a year for 20 years to raise money for the Glide Foundation, a favorite charity of his late wife that helps poor and homeless people in San Francisco.

Every winning bid since 2008 has topped \$1 million; Buffett has raised nearly \$34.5 million for the charity over the years. The weeklong eBay auction will begin June 12 with an opening bid of \$25,000 and continue through June 17. The winner will get to invite up to seven people to lunch with Buffett at the Smith & Wollensky steakhouse in New York City. The only topic that's off limits at lunch is what Buffett might buy next.

An all-electric FedEx delivery van broke a Guinness World Record when it made the drive from New York City to Washington, D.C., on a single charge. Brightdrop, a subsidiary of General Motors, announced that the van completed the 258.85-mile trip without recharging, earning the world record for greatest distance traveled by an electric van on a single charge. The journey was timed to coincide with Earth Day. The company says, ""Having a long battery range with reliable power is an essential part of electrifying last-mile delivery fleets everywhere."

We all know it's hard right now to hire people for every job where they are needed. One out-of-the-way employment opportunity must work extra hard to fill its seasonal position. A post office in Antarctica, the world's southernmost, announced this week that it is hiring. Job duties include selling stamps, hand cancelling mail, and counting penguins.

The post office at Port Lockroy is an expedition cruise and research destination on Goudier Island, just off the west side of the Antarctic peninsula. The historic site receives about 18,000 visitors each season. A British Antarctic territory, Port Lockroy was established in 1944 as a British research station. Now, it is managed by the UK Antarctic Heritage Trust, which operates a museum and gift shop along with the official post office outlet. The Heritage Trust team also <u>monitors</u> the impact of people on the Antarctic environment, which includes counting the number of penguins, penguin chicks, and penguin eggs on the island. If you were to accept the job, you wouldn't leave Rotary behind, since Antarctica is home to not one but two Rotary clubs.



Our own Maria Kachadoorian is not only a proud Rotarian but also Chula Vista's City Manager, appointed in June 2020. She is the first woman and first Latina to serve in this position. Maria is a long-time resident of South County and lives in Chula Vista. She has a BS degree in Accounting and MPA from SDSU. She is also a Certified Public Accountant and has been recognized by the San Diego Business Journal as CFO of the year. In addition to her many heavy responsibilities, she has often served as a key member of our fundraising committee and has volunteered for our annual Tijuana home build. Thank you, Maria. 
