

# JIM BIDDLE NEWS AT NOON



Hello, fellow Rotarians. Welcome to today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon. Today's News sponsored by Bob Bliss of Robert Bliss CPA.

With 99% of ballots counted, Chula Vista Councilmember John McCann is the projected winner of the City of Chula Vista Mayoral race, winning 52 % of votes cast, with opponent Ammar Campo-Najjar getting 48%.

Two divers searching the ocean for World War II-era aircraft instead found a piece of history from one of the country's darkest days. There in the sand, with fish swimming above it, was a 15-foot square section of the space shuttle Challenger, which exploded on the morning of Jan. 28, 1986. The accident killed all seven crew members on board including teacher Christa McAuliffe and was one of the worst in the history of the American space program. The discovery was located off the Florida coast near Cape Canaveral, northwest of the area known as the Bermuda Triangle. The piece will remain there until NASA decides what to do next, to properly honor the legacy of Challenger's fallen astronauts.

Our San Diego State Aztec basketball team is off to a strong start this season. They are 3 and 0 after beating Stanford on Tuesday, their first ever win against the Cardinals. and are ranked number 17 nationally in the AP poll. Now it's onto Lahaina and the Maui Invitational, where The Aztecs will meet Ohio State on Monday night.



My wife Marilyn's Uncle Lester was an Army Medic in World War II. Sadly, he was killed in action.

They took her on a tour that included several monuments and a chapel honoring the sacrifices these soldiers made.

You see, Marilyn had been told the story of Uncle Lester many times and it ended with him being killed. Now, she sees him at peace in a beautiful and well-maintained place. Carolyn's trip and the pictures brought her great comfort and closure on Uncle Lester's memory.


