Guest speaker, Jimmy Parker with Stockdale Capital Partners, shared their vision to transform Horton Plaza into a new Tech employment center—potentially housing up to 4,000 staff.

He also described plans to improve the park and make it more user friendly and welcoming—a place where visitors may even choose to "linger." There will be more trees and less stone.

Crews are already gutting some of the buildings including the old Nordstrom. They will be installing new windows and striving for LEED building status.

The project does not quite have an official name as of yet, but will definitely include "Horton."

Their research shows many local graduates leave San Diego for the Bay area and other areas. They believe they can draw major tech firms to the project.

Parker has spent most of his career in the downtown area including stints with Street Scene and the Gaslamp Quarter, which provided some interesting behind the scenes historical facts.
