

> Trolley to the Beach Eric Duvall Ocean Beach Historical Society Friday, October 1, 2021—Noon



Trolley to the Beach is a survey of suburban public transportation in the first half of the 20th Century in San Diego, California. It is the story of the Point Loma Railroad, the San Diego Electric Railway, and how dependable streetcar service allowed people to live in outlying areas of the city. It is the story of how the city grew.

JIM BIDDLE NEWS AT NOON



Good afternoon, Rotarians and guests. Welcome to today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon. Today's news sponsored by Bob Bliss and Robert Bliss CPA.

The White House announced on Monday that foreign visitors will be allowed to enter the country provided they have proof of vaccination and negative Covid-19 test results. The new rules will take effect in early November. The policy will lift the Covid-19 travel bans that have barred visits from citizens of the United Kingdom, the European Union, China, India, Iran, Ireland, Brazil, and South Africa. The lifting of U.S. travel restrictions applies to air travel only, not the land borders with Canada and Mexico, which will remain closed through at least October 21

Container ships were lined up this week off the coast of Southern California, waiting to deliver cargo at the Port of Los Angeles and the Port of Long Beach. The backup offered another sign of the supply chain problems hampering businesses across the globe. Sixty-one vessels were anchored offshore yesterday waiting to unload cargo, down from a record 73 on Sunday.

In addition to the anchored ships, 29 were waiting farther out, up to 20 miles offshore. That's down from a record of 37 set on Sept. 16. The delay in getting the container ships to port comes as the easing of pandemic restrictions, and an increase in consumer spending have ramped up demand. At the same time, manufacturing bottlenecks, labor shortages, and Delta variant uncertainty has distorted the global supply chain.

Our San Diego State Aztec football team has started the 2021 season with a bang. They're looking for just their second 4 and 0 start in the last 40 seasons when the Aztecs face Towson, a member of the Colonial Athletic Association located in Towson, Maryland, tomorrow at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, Calif. This is the Aztec's home away from home while their new stadium is being built on the site of the old Qualcomm Stadium. San Diego State enters the week as one of only 34 unbeaten teams out of 130 in the FBS, and is making a move toward entrance into the major top 25 polls.
