Hello, Rotarians and guests. Welcome to today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon. Today's News sponsored by Jerry May.

Most of the huge fires that erupted over the past eight weeks in Northern California are now fully or significantly contained but recent weather conditions may cause a resurgence of fire danger. Fire crews from across the state are being deployed to Northern California, where hot, windy conditions have renewed fire threats in the same region where massive blazes already have scorched more than 4.1 million acres, destroying hundreds of homes and killing or injuring dozens of people this year. As a further precaution, PG&E is cutting power to more than 100,000 people on a rotating basis in the Sierra foothills and the San Francisco Bay area.

The planet just recorded its hottest September since at least 1880. Data released Wednesday shows that 2020 is on track to be one of the hottest years on record, with the possibility of tying or breaking the milestone for the hottest year, set in 2016.
