Roberto Garcia and Blanca Romero with the U.S. Census were on hand to share information about the upcoming census. Roberto shared about the importance of the census and how it is mandated by the U.S. Constitution to be held every ten years. He outlined how it impacts people, money and power.

For people, the census paints a picture of our country and is used by government, business and others for planning, schools, infrastructure and more. On money, the census helps determine how much funding the Federal government sends to communities for a variety of programs including school lunches. For power, the numbers generated through the census determine all political jurisdictions from Congress to water districts.

The Census is gearing up for the count next year and for the first time, we will be able to complete the form online. Previous methods—phone, paper and in person will also be available. Everyone will receive reminder cards in the mail. March 2020 is the official launch.
