Guest speaker, Mr. Ron Caret, Division Chief, CALTRANS District 11, gave a very informative presentation on CALTRANS. CALTRANS is responsible for constructing new and maintenance of existing state highway system.

Fun Facts about the district: 4,200,000 lane miles, 3,000 acres of landscaping, 7 border crossings, spans 19 Tribal governments, 1,200 employees serving the district. Upcoming construction and/or maintenance projects in Chula Vista include constructing sound walls between Telegraph Canyon and H street. In order to preserve in select areas, the sound walls will be transparent. The Bus Rapid Transit lane 225 is scheduled for completion Spring 2019 and will run nonstop from the Otay Mall in East Chula Vista, to downtown San Diego. California Senate Bill 1 allocates \$54B in funds for maintenance and traffic relief. Future projects include completion of 125 connectors as well as widening the Sweetwater Bridge.
