Labor Day is a federal holiday in the United States celebrated on the first Monday in September to honor and recognize the American labor movement and the works and contributions of laborers to the development and achievements of the United States. It is the Monday of the long weekend known as Labor Day Weekend.

Beginning in the late 19th century, as the trade union and labor movements grew, trade unionists proposed that a day be set aside to celebrate labor. "Labor Day" was promoted by the Central Labor Union and the Knights of Labor, which organized the first parade in New York City. In 1887, Oregon was the first state of the United States to make it an official public holiday. By the time it became an official federal holiday in 1894, thirty states in the United States officially celebrated Labor Day.

Labor Day is called the "unofficial end of summer" because it marks the end of the cultural summer season. Many take their two-week vacations during the two weeks ending Labor Day weekend. Many fall activities, such as school and sports, begin about this time.



Good afternoon, Rotarians and guests. Welcome to the Jim Biddle News at Noon for August 28. Today's News brought to you by Maria Kachadoorian and the City of Chula Vista.

Seven Mile Casino on Bay Boulevard in Chula Vista reopened its doors to guests on Tuesday, but not inside the traditional casino that was started five years ago. Employees moved 25 card tables outside the Seven Mile Casino building into a 5,500 square-foot tent. The new set up include temperature checks before you come in, handwashing stations, every dealer wearing a mask, and clear dividers between each player.

Over 250 employees are back to work, sanitizing poker chips and swapping out cards for new decks throughout the day. The card games available are California Blackjack, Poker, Pai Gow and Baccarat. The light crowd on opening day enjoyed tacos from a food truck parked on site. Different trucks and different food will be on site every day. Security cameras at each Blackjack table not only monitor against cheating or theft, but also will assist in contact tracing if necessary. The large tent set-up actually yields more space than inside the existing casino building. The tent is the same kind of structure used for high end events such as the Oscars, and features huge air conditioning units pumping clean, fresh cool air into the tent to keep open air gamblers comfortable. The ability to explore various roles in each of the global scenarios was a valuable part of the experience.


