Agnes Barrelet, Executive Director and Founder of Children's Nature Retreat is an international entrepreneur and philanthropist who has found her calling in helping children. She has two parts to her work. The first is a Pre-school in West Africa which helps the young begin learning the French language from the 67 dialects they have in their homes. It was started in 2012 from 30 students to 150 now.

The second is a nature retreat on 20 acres in Alpine which houses 130 animals (often rescued) and 17 species. They have come from several states and Mexico and include zebras, camels mules, birds, chickens, etc. The retreat is for inner-city school children who have not been exposed to animals that they can feel and touch and feed, all for free. There is also a wellness center that caters to the needs of adults, like school teachers who also need the respite that comes from a visit to a corporate retreat. Most recently, they learned how to open, cook and enjoy eating an ostrich egg. Finally, she has brought on two rescue Great Pyrenees for guarding the animals (Yay!!)
