Ms. Rascon gave a comprehensive overview of the purpose, responsibilities, and activities of the Registrar of Voters. With the upcoming mid-term elections, as well as the numerous local elections, it is important for voters to understand the voting process and were to obtain more information on the polling process.

Demographic and statistical information was presented. For example, Interesting fact, the federal government requires ballots to be printed in the following languages: English, Spanish, Filipino, Vietnamese, Chinese. In addition, the state of CA requires ballots be printed in Arabic and Korean (voters specify the language when they register). For the November 6<sup>th</sup> election, they anticipate 485 candidates , 41 local measures, 594 ballot types x 5 languages = 2970 variations of the ballot.

In addition to explaining the ballot counting process and steps to preserve the integrity and security of the voting process, Ms. Rascon emphasized the importance of volunteer poll workers. Key components to our election are the volunteer poll workers, we have 6,000, but can go up to 9,0000 poll workers. Poll workers are champions of democracy
