JIM BIDDLE NEWS AT NOON by Betty Waznis



Hello, everyone and welcome to today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon. Today brought to you by Nancy Kerwin.

San Diego County last year saw its gross domestic product or GDP rise 1.4% to \$261.7 billion — bigger than half the states in America. Aso reported in data released Wednesday by the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, the U.S. GDP grew 2.9% to \$22.7 trillion — by far the largest in the world. San Diego County had the 10th-largest GDP in the nation. While San Diego County might not top the U.S. list, it still is bigger than the gross national product of many nations, including Greece and Hungary. Another way to look at it: The GDP of San Diego County is more than 25 entire states, outpacing all of Louisiana, Alabama, Utah, Kentucky and more. We have our science and technology industries to thank in part - after all we are part of what they call "Bio Tech Beach" – but we also have thriving blue collar, service, hospitality, and import/export sectors.

Balboa Park's Botanical Building and Gardens is finally ready for visitors again and will reopen today with limited hours, just in time for December Nights. The iconic structure is three years into a \$28.5 million renovation project meant to restore its original 1915 design with modern upgrades. This first phase renovation included restored historic stucco arcades, urns and balustrades, a new redwood lath roof, water-saving irrigation systems, new LED lighting, improved access for people with disabilities, and adding a flexible education and programming space. The building's more than 2,100 plants were moved to an offsite nursery for the duration of the project and will be replanted when construction is complete. Now, the renovation project is moving into Phase 2, the building's exterior, improving walkways, gardens and irrigation systems, and restoring fountains and a historic pergola.

One of our local businesses, Marine Group Boat Works, a massive boat repair and refurbishment facility, recently made Chula Vista an unlikely destination for the world's biggest, most exclusive yachts. The family-owned company, founded as South Bay Boatyard in the 1980s, was instrumental in securing a recent designation by U.S. Customs of a free trade zone for yachts in San Diego Bay. The zone, which encompasses both Marine Group's Chula Vista yacht repair facility and a mega-yacht dock operated by the company near the San Diego Convention Center, enables yacht owners to park their yachts and put them up for sale or charter without paying customs duties until an actual sale.

Outside such a zone, owners must pay a duty of 1.5 percent of a yacht's value the moment they put it up for sale, whether they find a buyer or not. That's a lot when applied to boats priced at \$30 million and up. It's estimated the free trade zone designation will draw roughly 12 additional mega-yachts to San Diego Bay per year, an additional \$7 million to the local economy This development vaults San Diego—and Chula Vista—into a rarified worldwide league of yachting destinations for the super-rich. Only two other U.S. cities have such zones: Fort Lauderdale, Florida and Newport, Rhode Island.
