JIM BIDDLE NEWS AT NOON by Betty Waznis





Hello, everyone. Welcome to today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon, today sponsored by Gary Bryant.

Evacuation orders are still in effect as the Highland fire in Riverside County continues to burn along Highway 371 near Aguanga. About 4,000 people were under evacuation at the worst point, but some have been allowed to return home. At least seven structures have been destroyed. More than 1200 firefighters are attacking the fire from the air and the ground. Although battling dry conditions and gusting winds, they managed to contain the fire to 50%. The fire is burning in an area that was saturated by Tropical Storm Hilary in August. However, the storm's rainfall contributed to the growth of new grasses, which then dried out and could be feeding the fire.

The next time you park on Third Avenue you won't need to scrounge for change. Chula Vista installed 435 smart parking meters last week. While the meters still accept coins, they now accept credit and debit cards, as well as contactless options such as Apple Pay or a new parking app. The meters are intended to create a more convenient parking experience and help manage parking demand. Customers can use the new IPS Park Smarter mobile payment app to find available parking spaces in the Downtown Parking District, concentrated around Third Avenue, between E and H Streets. Once a vehicle is parked, the app sends real-time alerts when the meter is due to expire, and customers can add more time directly from their phone.

After restoring the Hotel Del Coronado's front porch and lobby, adding a new grand entrance, and expanding the resort by 142 rooms, the resort is saving what may be the best for last — a renovation of all 367 rooms in the original Victorian Building. Starting the first of the year, the hotel will shut down each of the 367 rooms for more than a year as it embarks on the final phase of what is the single largest renovation since the Hotel Del opened in 1888. The hotel has the advantage of 534 newly renovated rooms across the 28-acre property that will still be available for guests during the renovation and will allow all Victorian room upgrades to take place at once. In addition to refurbishing the guestrooms, the hotel will be renovating the historic event spaces, including the 9,300-square-foot Crown Room, well known for its holiday brunches.

Two critically endangered Sumatran tiger cubs born this summer came out from their den last week at the San Diego Zoo Safari Park. The cubs — a female named Puteri, which means "princess" in Malay, and a male named Hutan, which means "forest" — were born July 12. They are the offspring of first-time mother Diana and father Dumai and are the first cubs of their species to be born at the park's tiger habitat in seven years. Considered critically endangered, only an estimated 400 to 600 Sumatran tigers remain on Earth. The Zoo says "These recent births are a significant contribution to the global population of this tiger species."

Our sponsor Gary Bryant began community service as a boy when his folks moved to the Mt. Helix area in La Mesa in 1957. He and his twin brother were 8 years. DeMolay, the Masonic sponsored Youth Group for boys 13 to 21, really cemented his initiation into community involvement. We know that he enjoys hunting, fishing, and shooting sports. Here are a few of his latest catches, from Louisiana and from Baja. Somehow, he finds time to lead, support and volunteer for multiple community and charitable organizations. 
