#### <u>Speaker</u>

Brian Millican, from The Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center.

Brian showed a very nice video of the Center. It is located on 155 acres in east Chula Vista. It opened in 1995, and later became the property of the City of Chula Vista. It hosts Olympic athletes from all over the world, and 2-3 major sports tournaments per year. It has a Boat House on Otay Lake. The Center is now raising \$50 million in funds to build a pool.

US athletes from the Center won 150 medals at the Paris Olympics this year, including 86 for Para-Olympic athletes who trained here.

In 2026, The Center will host the Rugby World Cup.

"Our vision is to provide the world's best training center for the world's best athletes. We help athletes achieve their dreams."

The Center has 300 beds, a modern sports medicine clinic, a 24 hour cafeteria, 7 grass fields, and is home to the U.S. Rugby and Archery Teams

This in one of three such centers in the US. Other two are in Lake Placid, NY, and Colorado.

The Center's "Vision 2028" is to win 50 Gold Medals at the 2028 Olympics in Los Angeles.

Good news from the DMV! On Monday they announced a major change for older drivers: those who are age 70 and beyond with good driving records will no longer be required to take a knowledge test to renew their licenses. An office visit is still required for a vision exam and an updated photo for those 70 and older who are renewing a driver's license. First-time drivers must still take a knowledge test, also known as the written test, as will newcomers to California who want a license.

Last week, San Diego State University got environmental approval to build a \$53 million bridge in Mission Valley, southwest of Snapdragon Stadium, that offers a much-needed north-south connection across the San Diego River. The Fenton Parkway Bridge project is a condition of the school's purchase of the former Qualcomm stadium site, now known as SDSU Mission Valley. The bridge will extend Fenton Parkway south over the San Diego River to Camino Del Rio North for cars, bikes and pedestrians. This will create a north-south connection over the river not subject to flooding, that relieve traffic congestion, available for biking and walking, giving access to the trolley stations just west of the SDSU Mission Valley campus. Construction is expected to start in 2026.

The International Longshoremen's Association agreed yesterday to suspend a strike begun Tuesday, that closed down major ports on the East and Gulf Coasts, following an improved wage offer from port employers. In a statement, the union said that it had reached "a tentative agreement on wages" and that its 45,000 members would go back to work, with the current contract extended until Jan. 15. The union said it was returning to the bargaining table to negotiate all other outstanding issues, including how much automation can occur at the ports.

Our San Diego Padres dispatched the Atlanta Braves with a 5-4 win on Wednesday to follow their 4-0 victory on Tuesday, completing a two-game sweep in the NL Wild Card Series. Wednesday's sold-out crowd of 47,705 was the largest in Petco Park history. For the third time in five years, the Padres will play the Dodgers in the best of five National League Division Series. Games One and Two will be played Saturday and Sunday at Dodger Stadium. Game Three and, if necessary, Game 4 will be back here at Petco Park on Tuesday and Wednesday. If Game 5 is needed, teams will return to LA on Friday.

Rick served eight years as a nationally-licensed head coach for the Eastlake High School Mountain Bike Team, and founded the South Bay Composite Team.

He is currently a performance driving instructor with Porsche Club San Diego. He is married to Carmen Richardson, with two daughters McKenzie and Cameryn. In his free time Rick can be found with his family and dog, helping out in the community, exploring the desert, or driving anything that blows his hair back!


**Bill Torre**
