JIM BIDDLE NEWS AT NOON by Betty Waznis



Hello, everyone. Welcome to today's edition of the Jim Biddle News at Noon. Today's news brought to you by Rasha Roshdy and AMNA Sanctuary.

Hurricane Milton, which came ashore Wednesday evening near Sarasota as a Category 3, cut across the Florida peninsula without losing hurricane strength, blasting some of the same areas recovering from Hurricane Helene less than 2 weeks ago. Its center had moved into the Atlantic Ocean north of the Bahamas by Thursday morning, but rain and wind were still lashing Florida cities, including Daytona Beach and Orlando.

Nearly 6 million people had been under evacuation orders, one of the biggest such orders in Florida history. More than 3.4 million customers, about a third of the state, were without power in Florida yesterday. More than 30 tornadoes on the opposite coast and major flooding throughout the storm path have killed at least 16 people, and the authorities expect the death toll to rise. First responders have rescued about 1000 people from flooded or damaged buildings or vehicles and other life-threatening situations after the storm tore across the state, battering barrier islands and ripping the roof off Tropicana Field in Tampa. Yesterday, a star was placed on the Hollywood Walk of Fame for Mario Lopez, a 1991 graduate of Chula Vista High School.

Since his 1989 breakout role on "Saved by the Bell", he's been a film actor, New York Times best-selling author, producer, and two-time Emmy winning host of the television program "Extra". He currently hosts NBC's "Access Hollywood" and "Access Daily" as well as the national radio show "On with Mario." He is a major supporter of many charities – his favorite is the Boys and Girls Clubs of America. Along with his professional acting career, which started at the age of 9, he started wrestling at the Chula Vista Boys Club, and then became a championship wrestler for Chula Vista High - go Spartans!

Padres fans, this has been quite a week of high highs and low lows in the National Division Playoff Series. The Pads answered the Dodgers Game 1 victory with two great wins in Games 2 in LA (where there were a few distractions) and Game 3, in front of 47,744 raucous fans on Tuesday. The fans set another Petco Park attendance record of 47,773 on Wednesday, ready for a party, but got to be there as the Dodgers won 8-0, their largest shutout in team postseason history dating back to 1916. Now it's a win or go home Game 5 with the series even at 2 games each. Tonight's game, set to begin at 5:08 p.m. at Dodger Stadium, will decide which team hosts the Mets in the National League Championship Series. If you want to relive the thrill of Tuesday night, you can visit Legoland in Carlsbad where a Lego model of Petco Park. made of 150,000 Legos. includes BEAT LA banners, and a Friar among the fans in the stands.


