

Good morning President Glenys and members and partners of the Rotary Club of Warners Bay.

On behalf of our 2022 Newcastle SEC Coordinating Committee, it is great to touch base you again. We are excited to welcome you to the 2022 Science and Engineering State Final Newcastle event. This will be held over three days commencing Monday 22 to Wednesday 24 August, the venue being the Forum Sports and Aquatic Centre at the UoN. Following the Newcastle SEC event we will be represented at this event by Merewether HS, Newcastle Grammar School, and Lakes Grammar - An Anglican School Warnervale.

With the support of the UoN Challenge Team we will coordinate, fund and host this major event that will include the 24 highest scoring high schools attending from regional NSW challenge events for one final place at the National Challenge Final in Bendigo on Friday 21 October.

For your information and assistance please, find attached the Interim Event Guide for NSW SEC State Final Newcastle. It is important to note the selected activities for the Newcastle SEC event that included Helter Skelter Shelter, Stringways, Turbine, ElectraCity, Grasping at Straws, Return to Mars, Confounding Communications and the Bridge will be repeated. They will all be updated to increase the difficulty factor. The competing students will wear a coloured wrist band to identify their group. Activities will then be draw out to select their full day or half days challenge activities.
